## CLARK COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)

## 6th SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE 2020-2024 CONSOLIDATED PLAN AND THE 2024 HUD ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

Clark County proposes to reallocate from unobligated/de-obligated CDBG program and administrative funds \$6,040,000 for the Southern Nevada Children's Advocacy Center (SNCAC) and \$3,700,000 for the James Down Towers property of the Southern Nevada Regional Housing Authority (SNHRA) as additional projects in the FY2020-2024 Capital Improvement Plan.

The funding for SNCAC will be used to acquire a property for a one-stop center where multidisciplinary services can be provided to children survivors of abuse and to their families. The facility will also serve as a nexus of SNCAC's direct services and its advocacy efforts against child abuse. The center shall house staff representing child protection workers, law enforcement officers, medical providers, prosecutors, family/victim advocates, forensic interviewers, and mental health professionals.

The funding for SNRHA will be used to aid in the renovation of 200 units within the James Down Towers senior public housing development to bring the units to modern standards and make them energy efficient. Proposed activities include renovations, increased site security, and energy efficient improvements.

Consistent with the Citizens' Participation Plan, the proposal is now being submitted for public comments. Comments should be sent in writing to <u>CRMInfo@ClarkCountyNV.Gov</u> or mailed to 1600 Pinto Lane, Las Vegas, NV 89106 and will be accepted until 5:30PM on March 17, 2025. Final approval of the funding is contingent on the projects' satisfactory compliance with the required environmental clearances.

Once approved, the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan and 2024 Annual Action Plan will be amended to reflect this allocation and submitted to HUD.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

The 6th Substantial Amendment to the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan and the 2024 HUD Annual Action Plan was posted for a 30-day public comment period in the Las Vegas Review Journal and El Mundo on February 14, 2025.
