The event, made possible by Commission Chair Marilyn Kirkpatrick, featured school garden-grown fruits, vegetables, and herbs, along with student-made crafts.

CLARK COUNTY, METRO ANNOUNCE EXPANSION OF 'SHOTSPOTTER' PROGRAM TO FIGHT GUN VIOLENCE



"The use of the ShotSpotter technology allows us to maximize our public safety resources throughout our community," said Commissioner Naft. "The expansion of this program will continue to help reduce crime and fight gun violence."

The Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and Clark County Commissioners announced the expansion of the ShotSpotter gunfire detection technology into several neighborhoods in the Las Vegas Valley after pilot programs showed successful results. ShotSpotter is an acoustic detection technology that uses audio sensors to detect, locate and alert police agencies to the location of gunfire incidents in real time. The technology does not replace the need for people to call 9-1-1 to report possible crimes in progress but enhances police response to scenes, evidence collection, and crime-fighting efforts to stop gun violence.

"ShotSpotter technology is a great enhancement to our operations and has proven itself to be quite effective in identifying illegal shootings that would normally go unreported," said Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Undersheriff Kevin McMahill. "The technology has resulted in faster response times, increased collection of evidence and an overall reduction in violent crime.

"The use of the ShotSpotter technology allows us to maximize our public safety resources throughout our community," said Clark County Commissioner Michael Naft. "We are proud to partner with Metro on this innovative initiative that has already saved lives. The expansion of this program will continue to help reduce crime and fight gun violence."

The technology has allowed Metro to detect and address more discharges of illegal gunfire, locate potential victims faster, and collect more evidence.
