








# UNITED STATES CENSUS HELPS ENSURE THAT SOUTHERN NEVADANS GET THEIR FAIR SHARE



"It is critical that Clark County residents complete their Census to ensure that we get our fair share of federal dollars. Funding will help us provide better infrastructure and social programs that improve our quality of life," said Commissioner Naft.

Every ten years, the US Census counts on our responses to calculate the distribution of federal funds to states. In 2020, the federal government will allocate \$675 BILLION dollars to states based on Census figures. This outside funding supports vital civic needs such as schools, housing, health care and transportation right here in Southern Nevada.

The closer we come to a complete count, the more money we receive right here. We're giving our money away to other states when we don't complete our Census forms. Participation in the Census not only helps Nevada get new federal support, it keeps many important programs alive.

"It is critical that Clark County residents complete their Census to ensure that we get our fair share of federal dollars. Funding will help us provide better infrastructure and social programs that improve all of our quality of life," said Clark County Commissioner Michael Naft.

Many of our vital, ongoing civic and social programs depend on the Census for allocations of federal funds. If we fail to maximize our participation, we not only lose out on federal funding, but stand to lose dollars for programs like Medicare and Medicaid, as well as dozens of programs benefiting our schools, highways and health systems.
