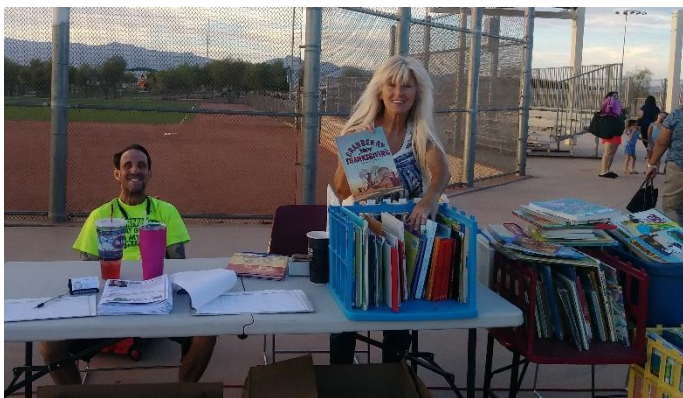
End of Summer Movie at the Pool

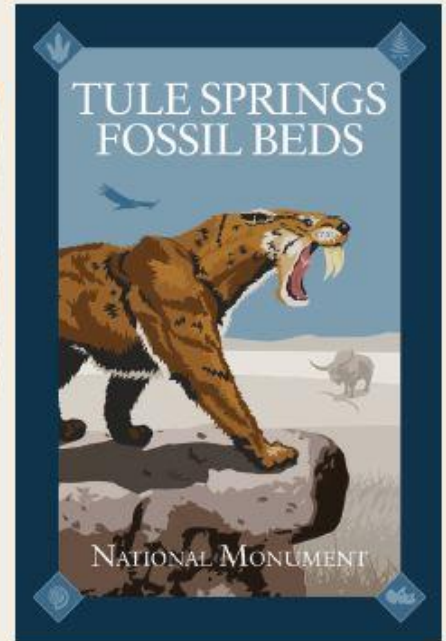
November 17 Star Gazing at the Clark County Shooting

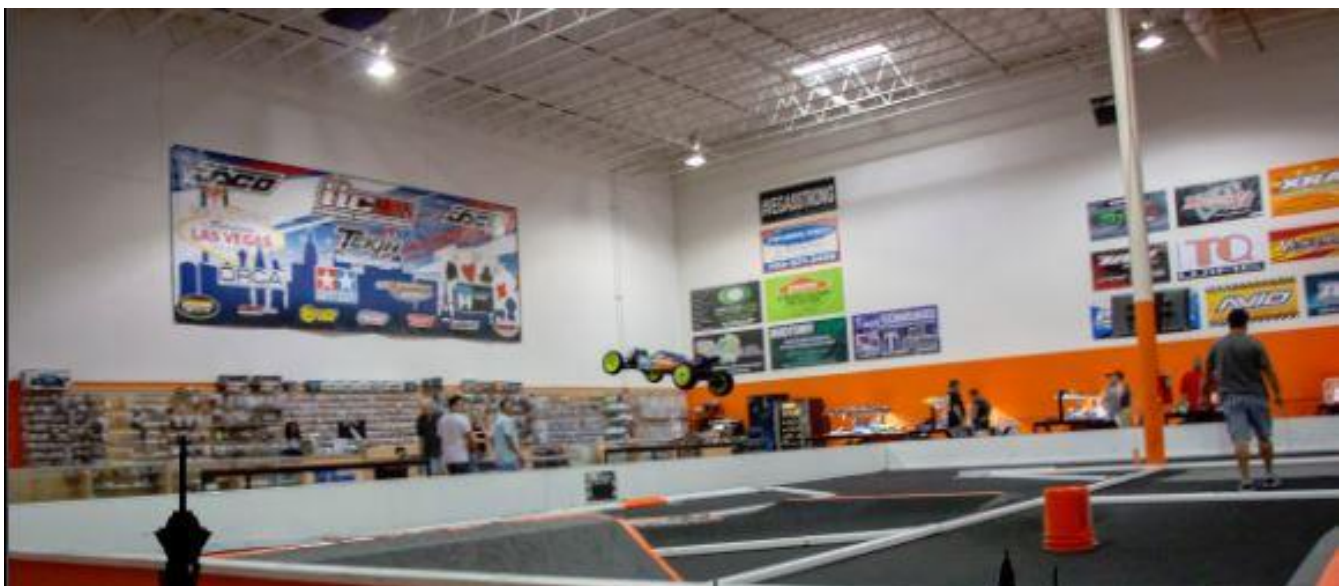

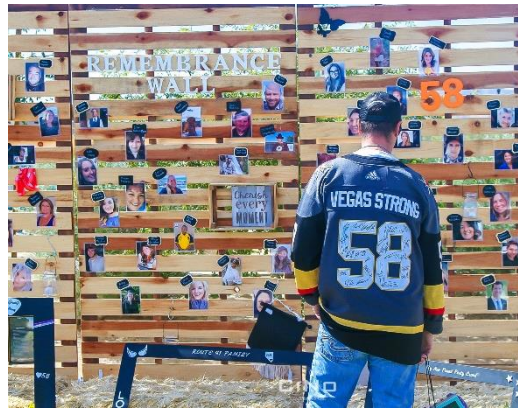
Clark County and the Vegas Strong Resiliency Center are hosting an exhibit of portraits of the 58 victims who lost their lives in the attack. The portraits were painted by artists from across the United States and around the world. Artists and cousins Ellen Abramo of Pennsylvania and Kortney Struempf of Georgia organized the Las Vegas Portraits Project in the days after 1 October to pay tribute to those who lost their lives in the shooting. As part of the effort they created a Facebook page seeking volunteer artists willing to illustrate a portrait of each person who died. Crosses that were put up at the Welcome to Las Vegas sign to memorialize those who died also will be displayed. Additionally, the “Art of Healing Mural” created by Las Vegas Academy of Arts students and the local Guerilla Artz Foundation will be on exhibit as well as a display of stained-glass angels made by volunteers of the nonprofit Angels of Love organization based in the city of Orange, Calif.

The exhibit, called “The Las Vegas Portraits Project,” will be located in the Rotunda Gallery on the first floor of the Clark County Government Center, now through Oct. 19.



Route 91 Reunion

Working with Route 91 survivor Shawna Barlett, Clark County, along with the City of Las Vegas, The Injured Police Officer's Fund, LVMPD and countless volunteers held a survivors reunion concert on Saturday, Sept. 29. The Reunion was created by survivors for survivors as an invitation only event. Opening ceremonies included a video tribute to the 58 victims, along with photos from the days following 1 October, and snapshots of new friendships, love and healing from the past year. The day was a perfect reflection of the love and strength that has made these folks #VegasStrong.

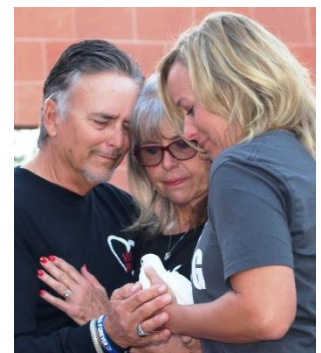


1 October Sunrise Remembrance



At 6:30 a.m. we gathered at the Clark County Government Center Amphitheater for the one year anniversary of the Route 91 Harvest Festival Shooting, for a sunrise remembrance ceremony to honor the lives of the 58 victims who were lost last year. Families and friends of victims, elected leaders, first responders and member of the general public participated in 58 seconds of silence and

a release of 58 doves each bearing the name of one of the victims. Mynda Smith the sister of Neysa Tonks, one of the 58, shared emotional words of inspiration.



World Suicide Prevention Day

On Sept. 10, together with fellow Commissioners Jim Gibson and Susan Brager, we joined representatives from the Nevada Coalition for Suicide Prevention in presenting a proclamation and turning the lights on the “Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas” sign purple in recognition of World Suicide Prevention Day. The month of September is also National Suicide Prevention Month. Nevada is the only state in the nation that has seen a reduction in its suicide rate. The message from us and the coalition is that help is available for those contemplating suicide or know someone who is.

Southern Nevada Health Department

On Monday, Sept. 17, a Family Health Care Center opened at the main health district office on 280 S. Decatur Blvd. 89107. Primary preventative care services for children and adults will be available; including annual physicals, well child check-ups, and sick visits for minor illnesses. Medical management is also provided for individuals with chronic medical conditions, such as asthma, high blood pressure, high cholesterol and diabetes. Services are available by appointment for insured, uninsured and underinsured patients. Call (702) 759-1800 for more information or make an appointment.

Flu Vaccine Clinic

The Health District offers flu vaccine at all Health District clinic locations each fall. An annual flu vaccine is the best way to reduce your chance of getting the flu. The vaccine takes about two weeks for antibodies to develop and offers protection from seasonal flu for about a year. Getting immunized as soon as vaccine is available ensures that protective antibodies are in place before flu activity is at its highest. You should get a flu vaccine by the end of October. However, you can be vaccinated anytime during the flu season.

Doing Business with Nellis AFB

Would your business like to build a relationship with Nellis Air Force Base and be allowed on base to make deliveries? Local services, goods and food establishments can apply for a 1-year Defense Biometrics Identification Systems (DBIDS) pass for up to ten employees to make deliveries to the base. When your request is received, your business will be verified for legitimacy, after which you submit a list of up to 10 names of delivery drivers who will be verified and checked for active wants, warrants or convictions that would pose a risk to the base. Guinness World Record Fundraising Event

Started by Lisa Parrish after the loss of her daughter Alicia, the Alicia Renee' Foundation assists families who have lost a child at birth or shortly thereafter and can't afford cremation or burial expenses.

On Nov. 10 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. they will be having a world record setting fundraiser. The foundation is currently selling numbered wiffle golf balls that will be dropped from a hot air balloon into a landing zone with a hole in it, the ball that lands in the hole wins. The plan is to release 20,000 balls setting a Guinness World Record. You do not need to be present to win, but why not come out and enjoy some food truck grub and hot air balloon rides weather permitting. Other small nonprofits (less than \$50,000 raised last year) have been invited to help sell wiffle balls to help raise money for their charity. No cost, just sell balls and receive 85% of the funds of the funds they raise.
