

Reduced MLK's chronic absenteeism by 15% in two years by providing wraparound services at the school.




#### **Mohammed Gaye**


DID YOU KNOW THE FOLLOWING:

In Clark County, we are up 28% year to date in fatalities, with 54 lives lost so far this year. Speed and impairment continue to be the top contributing factors.


 Speed is a significant contributing factor to driver, pedestrian, and bicyclist fatalities, accounting for nearly 1/3 of all traffic deaths in Clark County. **SLOW DOWN** 

SAFET

- Nevada law requires that minors under the age of 18 not operate a motor vehicle between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. unless they are driving to or from a scheduled event.
- Drivers who are under 18 when they receive their driver's license will not be allowed to drive with passengers under 18 (except for immediate family members) for the first six months.
- Speeding 30 MHP over the posted speed limit is a misdemeanor in Nevada. A violation carries up to six months in jail and/or a maximum \$1,000 in fines.
- Pedestrians should always be very cautious when walking in a crosswalk, especially when their visibility is limited by a vehicle already stopped at the crosswalk. At all crosswalks, both marked and unmarked, it is the pedestrian's responsibility to be cautious and alert before starting to cross the street.








# Reading with the Raiders

# **NEVADA CHILD CARE FUND**

Expanded support for families seeking child care

Eligibility requirements for child care assistance have expanded. If you weren't previously eligible for financial support to help pay for child care, you may be now.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I find out if I'm eligible for support?

Contact the child care resource and referral agency (CCR&R) in your region:

#### How do I know if my child care provider accepts this funding?

Your CCR&R can access that information. If the provider you use/choose is not currently enrolled, your CCR&R can help recruit them or figure out their barriers to participating.

Can I get help if I use an unlicensed in-home child care provider, such as a relative?

Yes. However, the provider must go through a registration process including basic health and safety certifications through your CCR&R to become a FFN Provider (Family, Friend, or Neighbor) who can receive subsidy payments.

#### How is the intake process done?

The intake process can be done in person, over the phone, or by video call. Your CCR&R will use the method that works best for you.

### If I have guardianship of a child, can I apply to help pay for their care?

Yes. If you have guardianship papers, a court order, or a statement from the parents, you may apply. If you are a foster parent or involved as a guardian in a child welfare case, we encourage you to apply regardless of your personal income situation. Please contact your CCR&R to discuss your case.

#### Does this cover before and after school care?

Yes. There are multiple providers that we contract with, including the Boys and Girls Club and Safekey facilities.

#### Fix leaks to save money and water

Leaks are hidden water wasters at homes, causing homeowners frustration to locate and repair costly leaks. New programs offered by the Las Vegas Valley Water District (LVVWD) and Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) provide financial assistance to help reduce the costs of leak repairs, saving homeowners money and precious water resources.

Customers who experience a high water bill, find unexplained damp surfaces around the home, or receive an LVVWD continual flow notification might be experiencing a leak. If you're experiencing

a leak, visit lvvwd.com to learn how to locate the leak on your property. If you need a professional, the SNWA's new Leak Detection Assistance Program offers eligible homeowners a \$250 voucher when using one of the SNWA's Water Smart Plumbers. LVVWD customers may also be eligible for up to \$1,000 in reimbursement cost for leak repairs (some restrictions apply).


