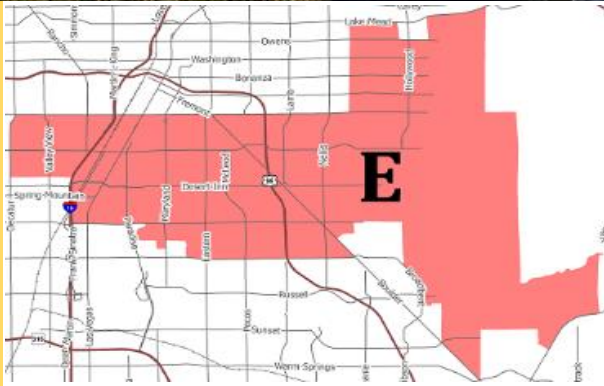
I hope you find the information provided in this month's newsletter to be both interesting and informative.

Enumerators	Some field positions require employees to work during the day to locate addresses on buildings. Other field positions require interviewing the public, so employees must be available to work when people are usually at home, such as in the evening and on weekends.	\$16.50 per hour
Recruiting Assistants	Travel throughout assigned geographic areas to visit with community-based organizations, attend promotional events and conduct other recruiting activities.	\$18.00 per hour
