### Full Steam Ahead for Goodsprings Trail Project

Years ago, the members of the Goodsprings Historical Society came up with the idea of a walking trail that would share the rich history of the town while also allowing people to enjoy the natural beauty of the area. That idea came one step closer to reality on Saturday, December 1, when Commission Brager scooped the first shovel full of dirt on what will soon be the Goodsprings Trail. The project was chosen for funding by the Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act in 2014. Since that time, community members, the Historical Society, engineers, architects, and County staff have worked together to create the design. The project consists of a large 2.2 mile loop with smaller loops and connector trails near the Trail Head. A portion of the trail follows a ridge line that provides sweeping views



of the town of Goodsprings and the surrounding mountains and canyons. Interpretive signage along the trail will share information about the history, flora and fauna in the area. The trailhead will include bathrooms, shade structures, and picnic tables. All parts of the project have been designed to have the rustic look of a mining town. A section of the trail will resemble a section of railroad track and a bridge over a drainage area will replicate the train that used to haul ore from the Yellow Pine Mine during its heyday in the early 1900's.

Members of the Historical Society were on hand for the groundbreaking and were excited to see their vision coming to life. The trail is expected to be open and ready for visitors in early 2019.
