
# **RURAL CONNECTIONS** STATE CHAMPS!!!

For those that may be unfamiliar with AEDs, here's a little information for you. The term AED stands for "automated external defibrillator." It is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses lifethreatening cardiac arrhythmias and is able to treat them through the use of electricity called defibrillation. This application of electricity which stops the arrhythmia, allows the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm.




