

# Work begins on Peace Park Renovations


After years of waiting and much anticipation, the final phase of the \$3 million renovation of Sandy Valley's Peace Park has begun! The upgrade of the well/water system for the entire site, which includes the park, Community Center, Library, Fire Station, Senior Center, and baseball field, was Phase 1 and was completed earlier this year. Phase 2 includes a splash pad, a walking trail, covered outdoor exercise equipment, new lighting, seating areas, and lots of other improvements. In order to expedite the project, the contractor will be working on all of the elements simultaneously. And, because the improvements are so extensive, the entire park must be fenced off and secured. It is going to be exciting to watch the transformation take place. The project is scheduled to be completed at the beginning of 2019. Commissioner Brager will host a dedication ceremony will be held in December with date still to be determined.






# State Route 160 Widening Continues

If you have traveled "over the hump to Pahrump" in the past year and a half, you have seen some major changes that NDOT has made to State Route 160 (Blue Diamond Road) between Red Rock Canyon and Mile Marker 17. The five-mile, \$16.5 million project included expanding the highway from two to four lanes and adding an additional passing lane in each direction. Completed on May 31, 2017, this was just Phase 1 of a larger project that is now continuing to the west.

Phase 2 involves a six-mile stretch of State Route 160 from Mile Marker 16.3 to Mile Marker 22. This \$58.6 million project will expand the highway from two to four lanes as the road goes up past Mt. Potosi Canyon Road and through the community of Mountain Springs. Contractors, in total, will move enough dirt and rock to fill 120 Olympic-sized swimming pools. The project calls for installing 5 miles of raised concrete median barrier, new signage, bicycle lanes, flattening side slopes for safer turnouts, placing new cattleguards and a wildlife undercrossing near Mile Marker 18. The Mountain Springs Community will receive new frontage roads, improved intersection lighting and an emergency signal for Clark County Volunteer Fire Station #79.

As Phase 2 gets underway, NDOT has been doing some blasting to remove bedrock outcroppings. Additional blasting will take place as the project progresses to the west. During the blasting phases, State Route 160 will be closed to traffic. Blasting days are intermittent and notification is being provided via message boards, emails and updates on NDOT's website:


## Sandy Valley Senior Center Celebrates 10 Years



This year around 125 people attended and picked up trash along the trails and campsites. Other tasks accomplished that day were painting trim on the new restroom and installing safety signage at key intersections.

BLM personnel handed out t-shirts and organized all the tasks, plus they had a variety of experts on hand to visit with the volunteers. Local BLM ranger for the trails, Stephen Neel, discussed safety gear with youngsters and Adam Floyd brought his personal pet tortoise to the event for kids to admire and adore. But, the BLM fire truck got the most attention as BLM fire fighters entertained a constant stream of excited kids.

The Girl Scouts were well represented this year as Jessa Freeman, for her Bronze Project, made a presentation about respecting the trails. The BLM was delighted with her efforts and many volunteers stopped by to read her display boards and thank her for her work.

The event ended around 12:30 but many stayed to enjoy the lovely September day by hiking, visiting with others, or going for a trail ride. In fact, many Vegas clubs have made this yearly cleanup a day-long activity for their members and plan different trail rides in the afternoon each year; the trails seem even more scenic with all the trash picked up!
