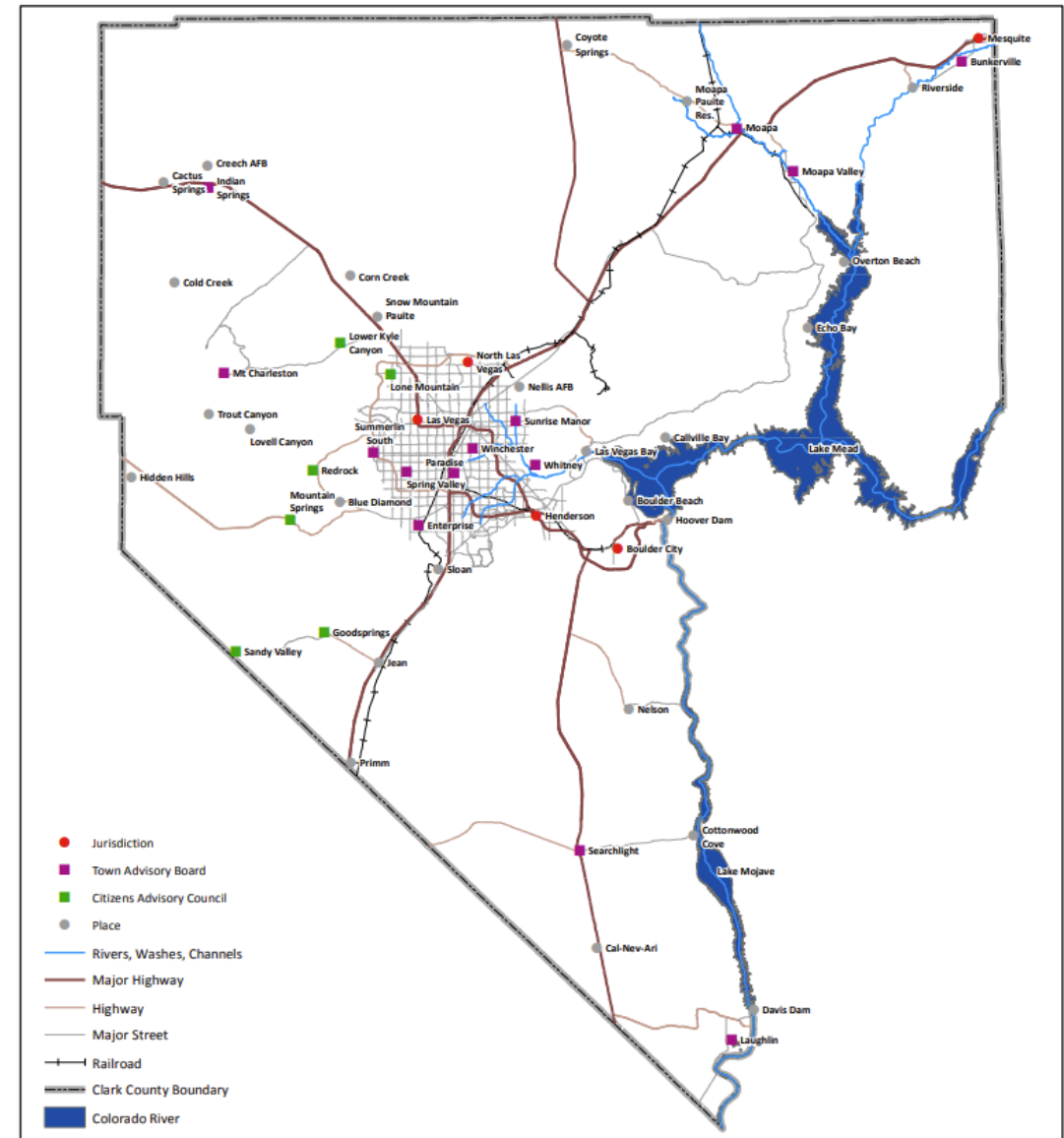

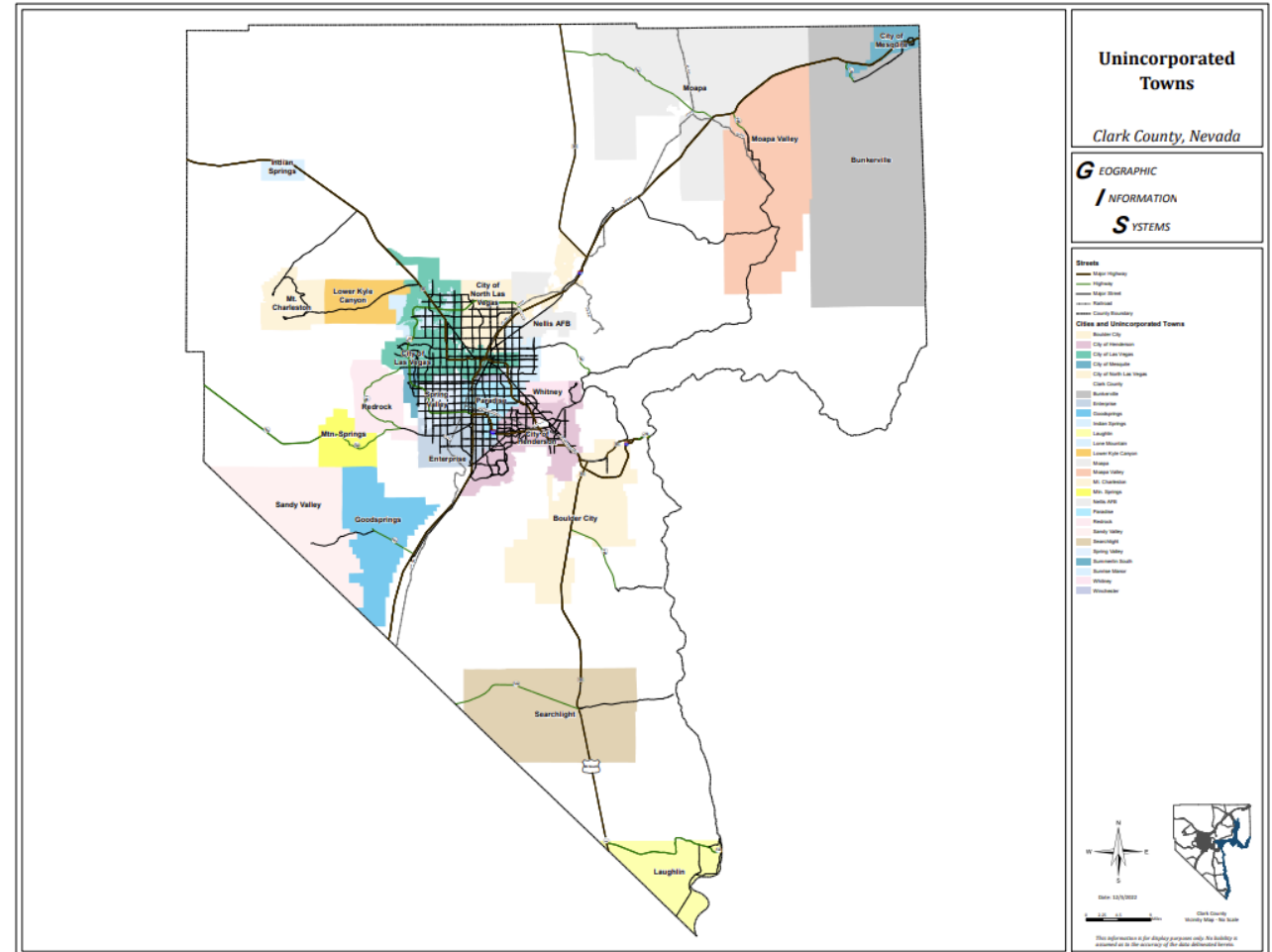
Overview of TABs/CACs

- TABs formed pursuant to NRS 269.576 & Clark County Code Chapter 3.30.
 - NRS 269.579 & Clark County Code Section 3.30.090 requires training of TAB members.
- CACs formed pursuant to NRS 244.1945 & Clark County Code Chapter 3.32.
 - Clark County Code Section 3.32.120 requires training of CAC members.
- Subject to: Nevada Open Meeting Law (NRS 241) & Nevada Ethics in Government Law (NRS 281).



TABs/CACs

- TAB members are either elected or appointed.
 - 5 TABs are elected
 - 8 TABs are appointed by the Board of County Commissioners (BCC)
- CAC members are appointed by the BCC.
 - 6 CACs, total

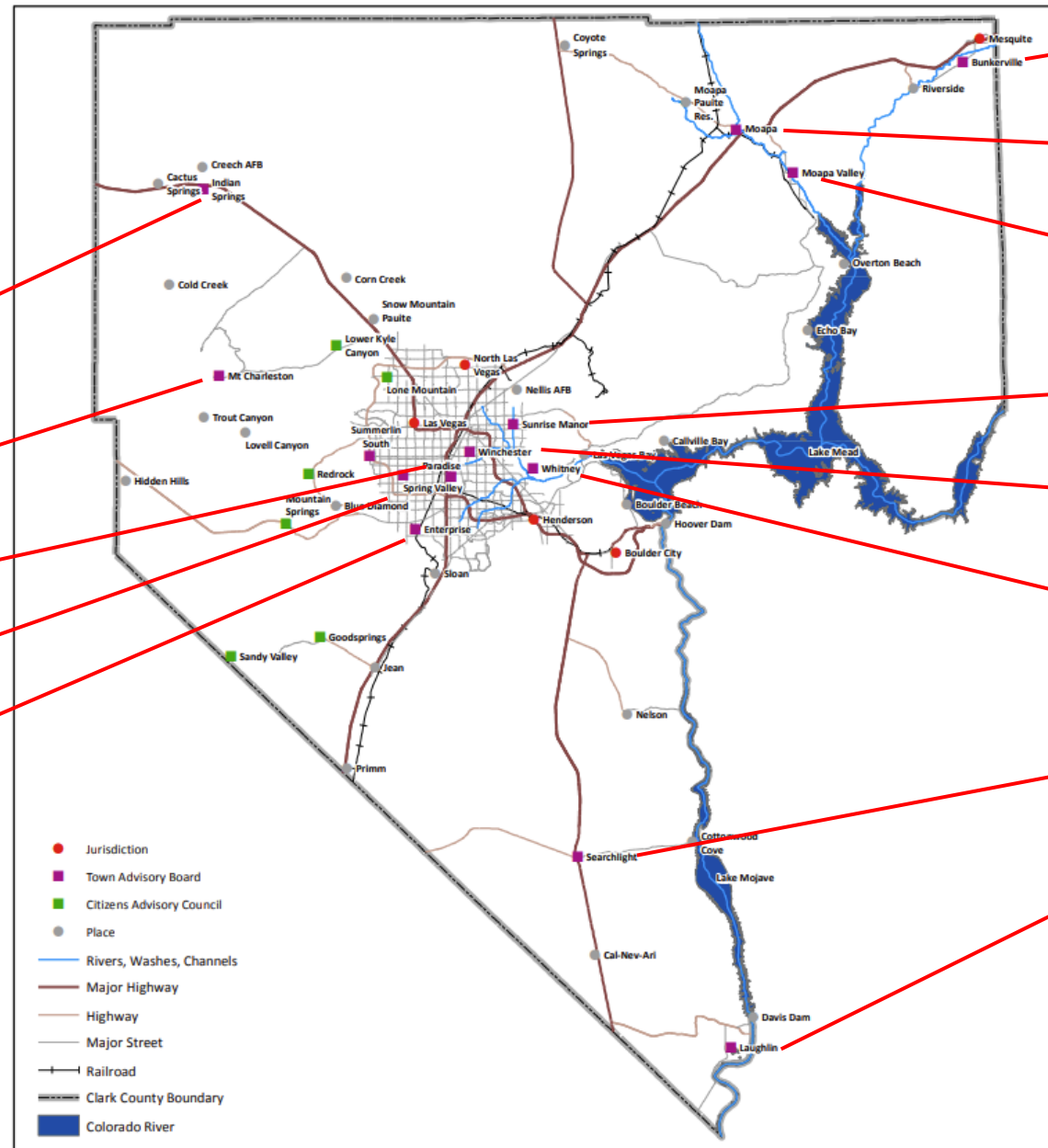

Lower Kyle Canyon

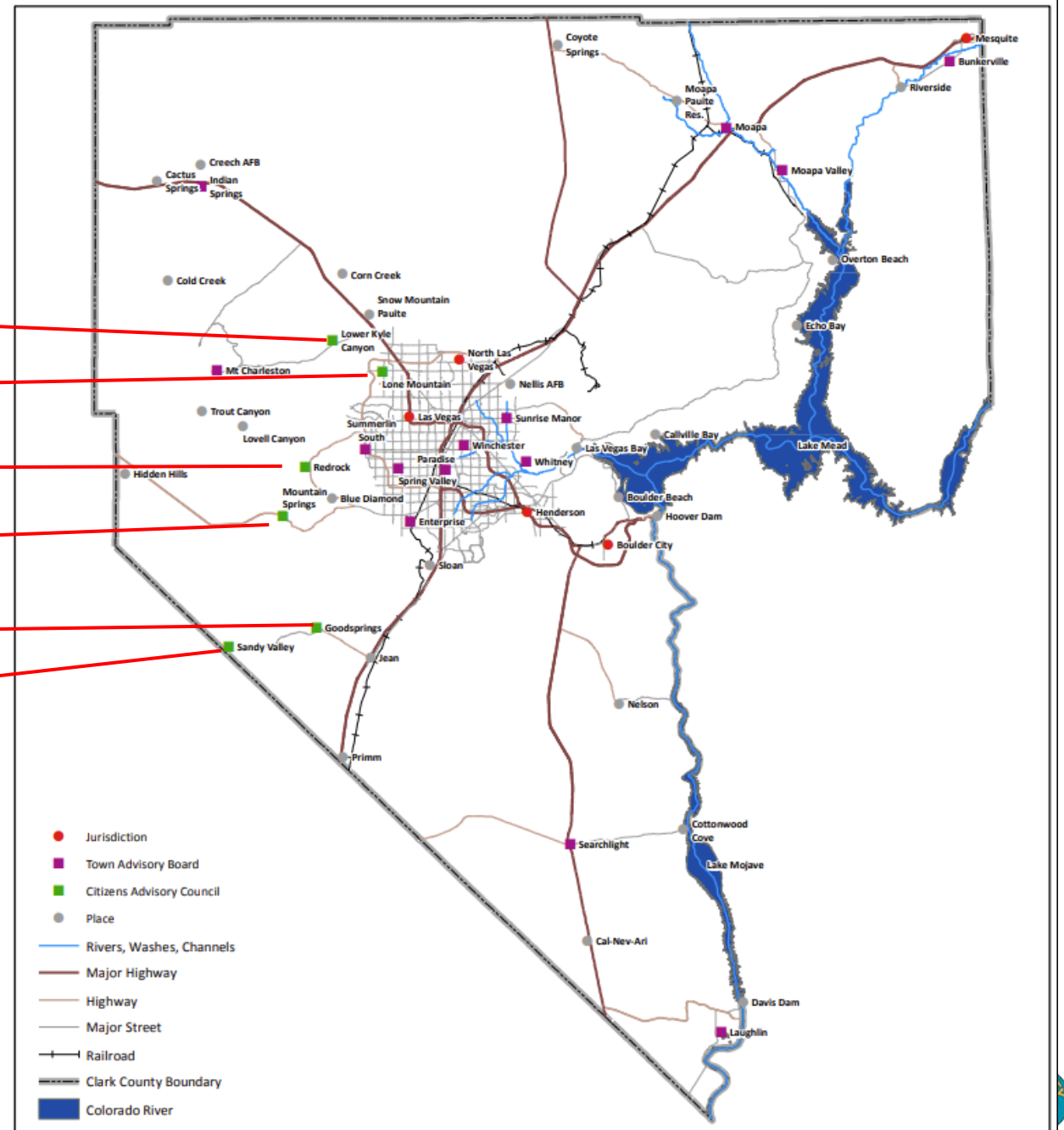
Lone Mountain

Role of TABs/CACs

- **Assist** the BCC in the governance of the unincorporated town or area by acting as representatives of the residents of the respective town or area.
- **Make recommendations** based on community input on issues pertaining to the town or area such as long-term planning, zoning changes, public works and park projects; **provide input** regarding resident concerns and problems to the BCC; and **disseminate information** from the County to the residents of the town or area.





Role of TABs/CACs

- **Operate** under the same rules as the BCC, including open meeting law, meeting conduct, and public comment periods.
- **Representative** of Clark County and the respective Commissioner(s) for the town or area.
- Input is valuable and appreciated, but remember, you are **Advisory Board**.
