Nevada Strong Start serves as a hub providing employees access to safe-licensed childcare. There are currently over 400 childcare facilities and Marilyn would like to see those numbers expand by 200 additional options.

The strong start center assists new daycares in getting started and helps existing daycares to expand their services.

The Vegas Chamber is assisting by offering free memberships with a savings of \$599.

CELEBRATING IMPACTFUL WOMEN IN DISTRICT B

Monique McReynolds was recognized for her career with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, her mentorship with Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada, being key with Pathway from Poverty, teaching elementary school children etiquette and for serving on the Sheriff's African American Recruiting Council. **Dr. Monica Cortez** is known for her role in fighting to get kids back into the classroom and back into sports.



Monica also serves as the Assistant Superintendent with the Clark County School District and is the former Assistant Principal of Western High School. **Joselyn Torres** works to preserve and utilize public lands by serving with the Conservation Land Foundation and serves as a commissioner on the State of Nevada Environmental Commission. Joselyn is a Dream Big Nevada board member who assists immigrant families and serves on the North Las Vegas Utility Advisory Board. **Judy Stokey** served with Marilyn on the legislature and retired from NV Energy after 43 years and was the first woman Vice President of Government Affairs for NV Energy. Judy serves on the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Foundation, and volunteers at Three Square. Finally, **Rosie Bone** is in her 21st season with Raiders and has served the last 8 years as the Community Relations & Public Affairs Senior Vice President. Rosie also serves on the Special Olympics Nevada Advisory Board and is on the Board of Directors for the Henderson Chamber of Commerce.

Of course, there were plenty of snacks for the kids to enjoy!

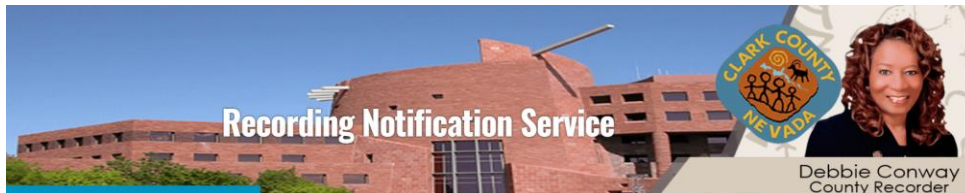

This is one tool that homeowners can use to be aware of when liens are filed on one's property. Although this is a great safeguard, it's important to note that there is no guarantee that you'll receive notice of every document recorded in your name or parcel.

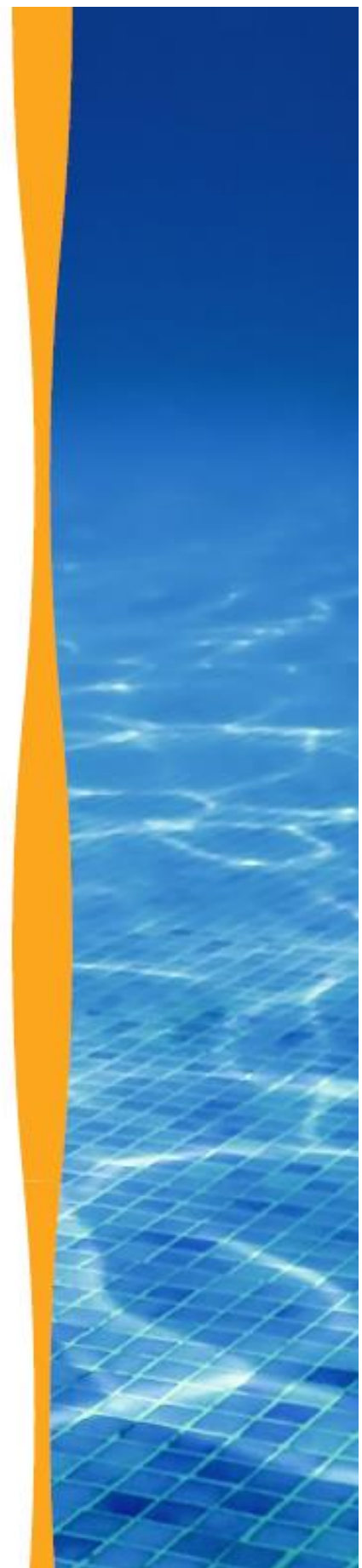

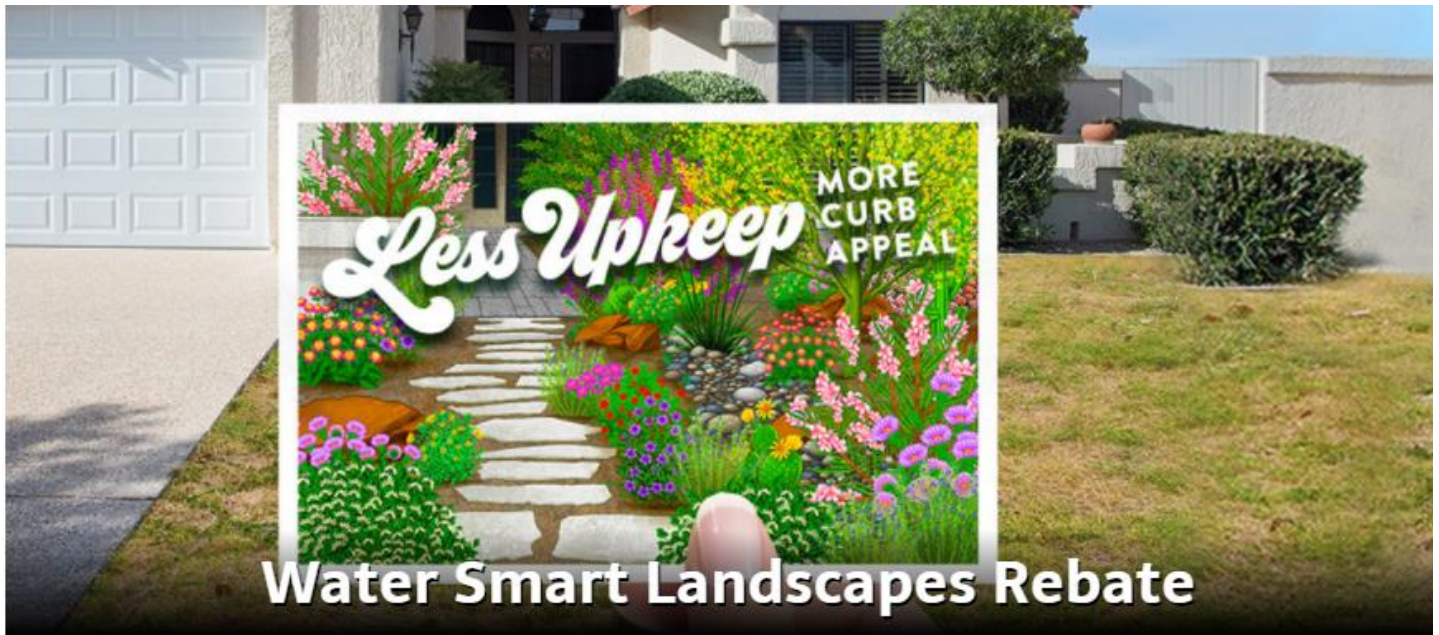

- Candidates must be 15 ½ and older
- Pay range \$12-\$17 hourly
- Candidates will be interviewed and will be required to attend a lifeguard class
- Candidate must be able to perform pre-requisite skills including: fifty yards of freestyle swimming, fifty yards of freestyle swimming with a lifeguard rescue tube, one minute of treading water without the use of hands, and the retrieval of a ten-pound object from the bottom of the pool

2. Protect - install fences, alarms, locks, and spa safety covers and keep lock doggie doors.
3. Prepare - enroll children in swimming lessons, take CPR classes and equip your pool with safety equipment including life jackets, flotation devices and rescue tools.
