The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m.

- V. Informational Items
 1. Receive a report from Las Vegas Valley Water District regarding the current well levels, status of the Blue Diamond Water System and other related concerns (for discussion only) – Natalia Londono reported that water levels remain consistent. At the last meeting there were discussions about how meters get assigned. Natalia stated when a developer submits plans for land then a meter would be assigned. It is based on the usage and size of the project. Meters cannot be reserved on undeveloped lots. The board requested a chart of the water usage at the park for the next meeting.
 2. Receive a report from Metro regarding activity and statistics during the past month and other area crime concerns (for discussion only) – Sergeant Dean was present but had nothing to report.
 3. Receive an update on the Red Rock Bike Trail from a representative of the Red Rock Trail Partnership (for discussion only) - Sheila Billingsley stated that there will be a meeting on October 16th with BLM and she will give an update at the next meeting.
 4. Receive a report from Clark County Administrative Services regarding construction on SR 160 and other updates from Clark County (for discussion only) - Meggan shared with the group that blasting will continue along State Route 160 toward Mountain Springs. Applications are being accepted for the 2019/2020 CAC term. Chair Bob Matthews thanked Public Works for doing a good job on Kulka Road, which was one if the items on last year’s budget request list.

5. Review FY 2017/2018 budget requests and take public input regarding suggestions for FY 2019/2020 budget requests (for possible action) – Meggan read the requests from last year and gave the updates on each item. Resident Sheila Billingsley asked to add a bike path to the list. Jeremy Jacobs suggested a request to review the drainage around the baseball diamond at the park. Both of these requests will be added to the list along with the past requests that have not been completed.

Discuss the date for a special call meeting for October (for possible action) – Meggan announced that the RV Park item was on track to be heard on the October 31st CAC meeting which had been cancelled at the beginning of the year. The council members discussed various different dates and decided that the date would be October 24th with the meeting taking place at the Quonset hut. Meggan noted that the meeting would need to be noticed following standard procedures.
8. Applications are available until Tuesday, November 13, 2018 for appointments by the Board of County Commissioners to serve on the Red Rock CAC for a two-year term beginning January 2019. (For discussion only) – Meggan made the announcement and reminded existing council members that they must submit an application if they want to continue to serve.

Board member Barbara Luke stated that only library users should be parking in the library spots when the library is open. Many times they are taken and they need to be for library customers only.

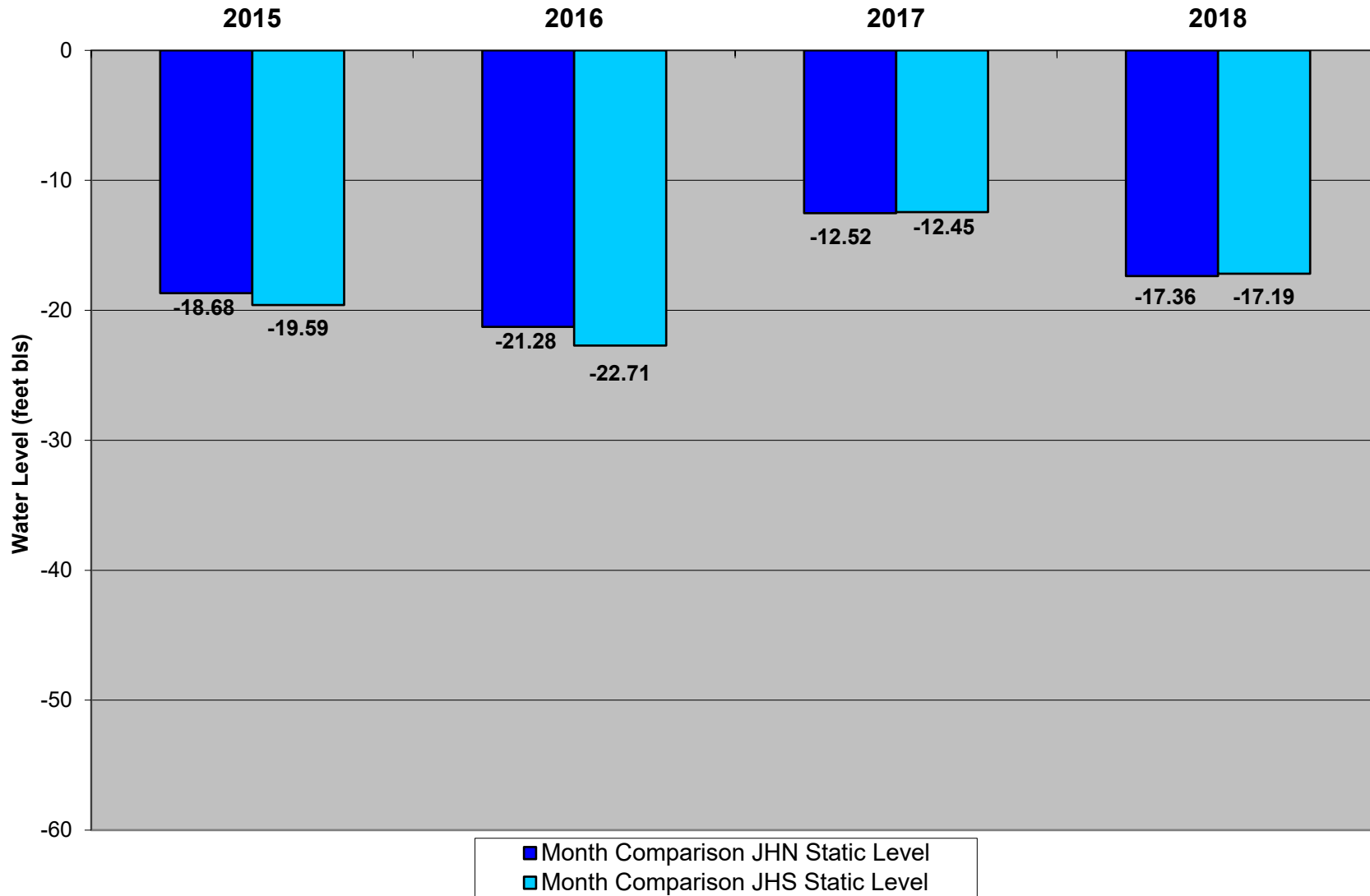
IX. Next Meeting Date
