District A's Allegiant Stadium to host the 2024 Super Bowl

NFL owners this month awarded Super Bowl LVIII to Las Vegas. Slated for February 11, 2024, the Super Bowl will take place at the recently opened Allegiant Stadium, in District A. It will mark the first time Clark County and the state of Nevada will welcome the Super Bowl.

"I am thrilled to help announce that Las Vegas will be the site of the 2024 Super Bowl," said Commissioner Naft. "This is the exact type of event and economic activity that was envisioned in the early days of Allegiant Stadium. I am particularly excited for what this means for our local community: \$500 million in total economic impact, thousands of jobs, opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses, and the chance to showcase what we all know is the Greatest Arena On Earth," said Naft.

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All Around A: From Flamingo/215 to Laughlin and everything in between

During December meetings of the Board of Clark County Commissioners several well deserving individuals received recognition from Commissioner Naft and his colleagues. The Veterans Action Group, host of the Las Vegas Veterans Day Parade received a proclamation thanking them for hosting yet another successful event.

Also recognized were Miko and Dale Swedberg, LVMPD Volunteers. The two have contributed more than 5,000 hours of service to the department, much of that time in District A.

In December, Commissioner Naft attended dozens of community events. The holidays were celebrated in Inspirada, Allegiant Stadium, T-Mobile, The District at Green Valley Ranch, and the County Government Center. Also around town, The Vegas Chamber hosted an installation ceremony for their new Board of Directors, Mark Shunock and Monday's Dark celebrated eight years of giving back to the community at their annual gala, The LVCVA celebrated Hospitality Heroes at UNLV, and the Flamingo Senior Center hosted their holiday party.

In preparation for New Year's Eve, Commissioner Naft participated in several briefings and exercises with law enforcement agencies tasked with keeping our residents and visitors safe on and around the Las Vegas Strip. After the event, 22 street sweepers collected an average of 10-12 tons of trash from the Strip.

Community Survey Seeks Input on State Mandate to Regulate Short-term Rentals

Short-term rentals such as Airbnb and VRBO are currently illegal in residential areas in unincorporated Clark County. However, the passage of Assembly Bill 363 by the 2021 Nevada Legislature requires the County to enact an ordinance regulating short-term rentals by July 1. The first step in this process is the survey. County officials will take the survey responses under consideration as they develop an ordinance that includes limitations on such rentals. AB363 places some of these limits as part of the mandate, including on minimum distance separation between short-term rentals, proximity to resort hotels, limits on the number of occupants and number of permits a person may hold.

Because of the potential impact of short-term rentals on neighborhoods, officials believe the brief survey, which takes about 10 to 15 minutes to complete, is important and urge County residents to let their voices be heard. It is available now at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/survey.

The survey asks about respondents' experience with and perception of short-term rentals in their neighborhood, and seeks community input on factors to consider in drafting the mandated ordinance. The survey will be held open until the end of January. Survey responses will be used to assist staff in drafting an ordinance to be presented to the County Commission.

Commissioner Naft hosts Inspirada Coffee and Conversation, other events in January

“Keeping the lines of communication open is a priority,” said Commissioner Naft. “It is always gratifying meeting with neighbors, hearing their concerns, and discussing solutions. With redistricting, residents in Anthem and Inspirada now have two advocates on the Commission.”
