#### Construction For Red Rock Canyon Multi-Use Paved Trail Will Start In 2025

#### Boxing Legend De La Hoya Donates \$20,000 to CCSD Teachers [In District F]

Oscar De La Hoya gave \$20,000 to help 13 low-income Las Vegas schools. The schools are in Clark County's District F in the west valley. Commissioner Justin Jones, who represents District F, presented the foundation with a proclamation thanking it for the donation. "Despite the federal funding, many of our Title I teachers find themselves spending their own money on school supplies, which just isn't right," Jones said.



#### Desert Breeze Park Readies a New Events Center to Serve the Neighborhood

Expansion of the park has been a "dream" of the county since before Jones was elected to represent District F in 2018. "We're trying to make it so that it's a place where people can live, work and play and get out of their car. ## Economic Development: Building Lasting Opportunities

This year, we focused on economic development in District F, with an emphasis on revitalizing key areas and creating lasting opportunities. Two major initiatives, the Spring Mountain Corridor Redevelopment Plan and the Sloan Master Plan, stand out in this effort, each aiming to transform these areas into thriving economic hubs.

The Mountain Spring Corridor Redevelopment Plan, launched earlier this year, focuses on cultural appreciation, small business support, and increased walkability while encouraging mixed-use development. This community-driven plan integrates urban redevelopment with cultural preservation, aiming to revitalize the area into a vibrant, inclusive neighborhood. It will support existing and new residential, commercial, and recreational transit-oriented spaces, development, and community gathering areas.




The plan also emphasizes job creation, local entrepreneurship, and protecting small businesses and industries within the Corridor. In the long term, the Visioning Plan will serve as a roadmap to guide community goals and foster a strong, diverse economy that benefits everyone.

This year also marked the beginning of the Sloan Master Plan, which addresses the growing demand for industrial space in Clark County. Situated at the southern end of the Las Vegas Valley with access to various transportation routes and adjacent to the future Brightline West maintenance facility, Sloan offers an ideal location for large-scale industrial uses. Developed with input from public utilities, NDOT, real estate professionals, and property owners, this plan will establish a robust road and drainage network, extend utility infrastructure, create sites adaptable for diverse

industries, and incorporate innovative technologies.

Both initiatives embody our commitment to sustainable economic growth, supporting District F's position as a thriving hub for business, culture, and community.



## Building Strong, Connected Communities in District F

### Building Community through New Parks and Gathering Spaces

This year, we proudly introduced Battle Born Park, a new addition to our community, strategically located near schools on Le Baron Avenue & Lindell Road, Battle Born Park serves as a vibrant gathering space for students, families, and residents, fostering outdoor recreation and community engagement. The park boasts diverse amenities, including a playground, an open grassy area for picnics and sports, walking paths with shaded seating, an obstacle course, and a splash pad. This new addition highlights our dedication to creating family-friendly environments that promote health. activity, and togetherness.

In addition, the recently completed Lt. Erik Lloyd Memorial Park offers valuable new resources for residents. Located at the corner of Tee Pee Lane and Patrick Lane, this 10-acre park features dog runs, a playground, tennis courts, and a splash pad, providing ample space for community members and their pets to enjoy.

## Enhancements to Parks and Public Amenities

Alongside these new parks, significant upgrades to existing facilities have been prioritized to meet the needs of District F residents. Key improvements include:

- Desert Breeze Aquatic Center: Resurfacing the indoor pool decking to ensure a safe, high-quality experience for swimmers.
- Fire Station 26: Replacement of the emergency generator and transfer switch, ensuring continued preparedness and response capabilities.
- Olympia Park: Installation of a perimeter fence around the soccer field, promoting security and enhancing the experience for park users.
- Sandy Valley Community Center: Replacement of the parking lot, improving accessibility and convenience for residents.



## Investing In Mental Health Services

Addressing access to mental health services is a top priority for Clark County, our community, and myself. This year, in partnership with the Clark County Office of Community and Economic Development, we are proud to announce a \$425,000 grant to the Boys & Girls Clubs of Southern Nevada (BGCSNV). This funding will expand mental health services for Club members ages 5 to 18 at all 13 Clubhouses across the region.

This collaboration is a critical step in addressing the mental health crisis facing our youth. Even before the pandemic, rates of anxiety, depression, and suicidal behavior were on the rise—challenges only intensified by COVID-19. The BGCSNV's innovative mental health program not only provides direct support to young people but also helps train future mental health professionals through internship opportunities.

Investing in mental health is essential to the success of our youth, and this grant represents a significant commitment to their well-being and the future of Southern Nevada. By supporting BGCSNV's efforts, we are not only ensuring that young people across the region have the resources they need to thrive but also fostering workforce development. This investment will contribute to а healthier. stronger community for years to come.

Stay tuned in 2025 for more improvements to our mental health

system, including the opening of the first crisis stabilization center in Southern Nevada and the expansion of the 988 crisis lifeline system.



## Accessibility And Reliability Across The District

In 2024, we made significant strides in construction and road improvement projects across District F, with a total investment of approximately **\$127 million**. Key completions included:

- **Tee Pee Lane and Patrick Lane** improvements: \$2.8M
- Cactus Avenue improvements from Fort Apache Road to Buffalo Drive: \$19.9M
- **Decatur Boulevard** enhancements from Tropicana Avenue to Sahara Avenue: \$25.6M
- **Katie Avenue** upgrades from Tomsik to Cimmaron: \$2.4M

- Mountains Edge Rush Channel
  Pedestrian Bridge: \$1.2M
- Roundabout improvements in the Summerlin area, including sidewalk ramp updates, striping, and traffic sign upgrades: \$4.3M

Looking ahead to 2025, we anticipate an investment totaling over **\$86 million**, with key projects including:

- \$50 million: Jones Boulevard improvements from Blue Diamond Road to Windmill Lane, connecting to the 215 by Q3
- \$13.2 million: Fort Apache Road upgrades from Blue Diamond Road to Huntington Cove, to be completed by Q1
- \$7.8 million: **Badura Avenue** improvements from Durango Drive to Tenaya Way, to be completed by Q3
- \$6.1 million: **Decatur Boulevard** upgrades across multiple segments, estimated for completion by Q2
- \$3.4 million: Pedestrian flashers and safety improvements on Jones, Pyle, Star Hill, Cactus, and Torrey Pines; pedestrian flasher installations at Dean Martin and Southern Highlands (completion TBD)
- \$5.1 million: Goodsprings Phase 1





## District F Blooms In 2025

In 2025, we are making a transformative investment in the future of District F. with over \$125 million dedicated to essential infrastructure and community improvement projects. This substantial commitment underscores our ongoing focus on enhancing transportation, safety, and recreational opportunities for residents and visitors alike. Key projects include the expansion of Desert Breeze Park to add new baseball fields. crucial road improvements on Spring Mountain Road, and the development of exciting new spaces like the Southwest Ridge Bicycle Skills Park. These initiatives will have a lasting impact on the quality of life in District F.



Additionally, the construction of Fire Station 39 will greatly enhance safety for families in the Mountain's Edge and Southwest communities, delivering faster emergency response times and ensuring better protection for residents in this growing area. By prioritizing these initiatives, we're not only building for today but also laying a strong foundation for the growth and vibrancy of our community for years to come.
