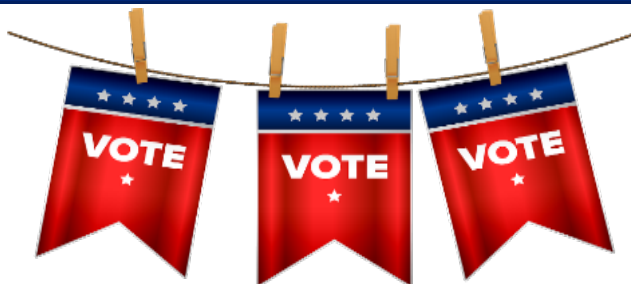

## REGISTER OR UPDATE YOUR REGISTRATION

Register or update your registration record today! When you change your address, name or political party, be sure to inform the Election Department **BEFORE** the registration deadline. View your registration information on record with the Clark County Election Department by logging in to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and selecting “**View My Registration Information**”. You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683). If you have a Nevada DMV-issued driver’s license or Identification Card, you can register or update your registration record online at [Nevada Voter Registration \(nv.gov\)](#).



## IMPORTANT DATES & INFORMATION FOR THE 2022 ELECTION

### **NOVEMBER 8, 2022, ELECTION DAY** (FEDERAL / STATE / COUNTY / MUNICIPAL)

All voters registered in Clark County, NV, may vote at any early voting site or from 7am to 7pm on Election Day at any Vote Center of their choice in Clark County, including those who received a mail ballot and have not yet returned it. All early voting sites and Election Vote Centers will also serve as **mail ballot drop-off locations**. Candidates who receive the most votes in a General Election are elected to office. You may vote for all offices and questions on the ballot for your precinct, regardless of your party affiliation. A General Election must be held throughout the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November in each even-numbered year. (NRS 293.12755)

**Standard Registration Deadline:**

Last Day to register to vote or update your existing registration via the **DMV** and to **mail** or **turn in a paper registration applications**.

**Online Only Standard Registration:**

Register to vote or update your existing registration online **ONLY** on the Secretary of State's website. After these dates, new registrants will need to register and vote a provisional ballot at one of the polling place sites. (Additional information on provisional voting can be found at [www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote](http://www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote).)

**Deadline for the Election Department to mail In-State Ballots:**

Mail Ballots must be ready for distribution to in-state voters no later than 20 days before Election.

**Early Voting (14 Days):**

Any registered voter registered in Clark County, including those who received a mail ballot and have not yet returned it, may vote at any early voting site within the County. Hours and days vary by location. (NRS 293.3568)

**November 12, 2022**  
Saturday, 5pm

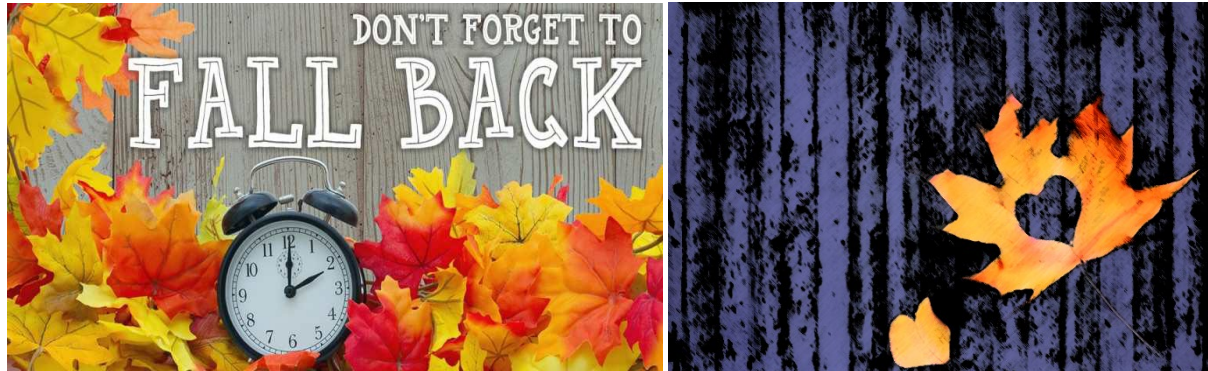
**Deadline to Receive Postmarked Mail  
Ballots Through the Post Office:**

By 5pm on the fourth day after Election Day, the Election Department must receive your voted mail ballot postmarked no later than Election Day.

**November 14, 2022**  
Monday, 5pm

**Deadline to Cure Mail Ballot Signature:**

You will have until 5pm on the sixth day after Election Day to provide a signature confirmation or an actual signature, as applicable.

## **U.S. POST OFFICE INFORMED DELIVERY**



Digitally preview your mail and manage your packages scheduled to arrive soon! Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mailpieces and track packages in one convenient location. You can check the delivery of your mail ballot with this easy to use service. The “Raise the Vote” partnership is designed to provide community organizations and businesses with an opportunity to participate in the electoral process in Clark County. At the same time, organizations can raise funds for the worthy causes in which they support. Each participating organization or business “adopts” a specific Vote Center, or several Vote Centers, for the election cycle by providing the personnel to staff that Vote Center. If the organization has a W-9 form on file with the IRS, the Election Department writes a check to the organization rather than pay each individual worker. Otherwise, volunteers will be paid

individually and can then donate their pay to their organization. By forming a partnership with the Election Department, funds raised are directed towards worthwhile causes and the voters are served by qualified workers at the polling places.
