2019 Municipal Elections for Boulder City, Henderson, Las Vegas, and North Las Vegas Only

> **Primary Early Voting**: March 16 – 29, 2019 Hours and days vary by City location.

PRIMARY ELECTION DAY

April 2, 2019 Vote 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

General Early Voting: May 25 – June 7, 2019 Hours and days vary by City location.

> **GENERAL ELECTION DAY** June 11, 2019 Vote 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

NEW: Voters within the boundaries of Boulder City, Henderson, Las Vegas, and North Las Vegas can vote at any Vote Center during Early Voting or on Election Day. Hours and locations can be found at <u>www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote</u>.

Important Dates for the 2019 Primary Municipal Elections

Municipal Elections are in odd numbered years. Specific dates for 2019 are below. All Municipal Elections (Primary and General) are Nonpartisan. Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County may NOT participate in Municipal Election, i.e., only voters registered within the boundaries of incorporated cities (Boulder City, Henderson, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas), except Mesquite. Mesquite consolidates its municipal election with Federal/State Elections in even-numbered years. For more information about Municipal Elections, contact your <u>City Clerk</u>.

April 2, 2019, Primary Municipal Election (NRS 293C.175)

Vote 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day at <u>any</u> Vote Center of your choice, only voters registered within the boundaries of Boulder City, Henderson, Las Vegas, and North Las Vegas.

March 5 Tuesday, 9:00 p.m.	Close of Standard Registration: Last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration, without having to appear in-person at your <u>City Clerk's office</u> , or without having to register on the <u>Secretary of State's website</u> . (NRS 293C.527)		
March 6 - 12 Wednesday - Tuesday	Extended In-Office and Online Registration (7 Days): You may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY by the following means: (1) In-person at your <u>City</u> <u>Clerk's office</u> or one of the two <u>Election Department offices</u> ; or (2) On the <u>Secretary of State's website</u> . (NRS 293C.527)		
March 13 - 14 Wednesday - Thursday	Extended Online Registration (2 Days): You may register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY on the <u>Secretary of State's website</u> . The Election Department/City Clerk is NOT legally required to send you a sample ballot for the current election if you register or update your address during these two days. (<u>NRS 293C.527</u>)		
March 16 - 29 Saturday - Friday	Early Voting: You may vote before Election Day at <u>any</u> early voting location of your choice if you are registered at an address within the city boundaries of Boulder City, Henderson, Las Vegas, or North Las Vegas. Hours and days vary by location. (NRS 293C.3568)		
March 26, 5:00 p.m. Tuesday	Mail/Absentee Ballot Request Deadline: Last day for your <u>City Clerk</u> or the <u>Election Department</u> to RECEIVE WRITTEN mail ballot requests. (293C.312)		

VIEW YOUR SAMPLE BALLOT ONLINE

E-Sample Ballots will be emailed to eligible voters starting March 6, 2019 and for those receiving a regular paper sample ballot; the mailing begins March 7, 2019 for the 2019 Primary Municipal Elections. Check Your Voter Record

Directly Notify the Election Department

When you change your address, name or political party, be sure to inform the Election Department BEFORE the <u>registration deadline</u>. Updating your DMV or Post Office records will NOT also update your voter registration. Quickly see your registration information on record with the Clark County Election Department by logging in to our <u>Registered Voter Services</u> and selecting **View My Registration Information** from the dropdown menu.

Address Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may <u>change your address online</u> at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our <u>Registered Voter Services</u> and select **Change My Address** from the dropdown menu to complete and print a form to mail before the registration deadline; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your address change before the <u>registration deadline</u>. If non-forwardable mail, such as your Voter Registration Card or sample ballot, is returned as "undeliverable" or indicating you've moved, your registration may become "<u>inactive</u>." The National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires the Election Department to CANCEL your registration if your registration is "inactive" and you do not vote in two consecutive federal elections. You must then re-register to vote again.

Party Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may <u>change your political party affiliation online</u> at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our <u>Registered Voter Services</u> and select **Change My Party Affiliation** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your party change before the <u>registration deadline</u>.

Name Changes

Login to our **Registered Voter Services** and select **Change My Name** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application. You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your name change before the registration deadline. When you change your name by marriage or other legal means, properly complete a Voter Registration Application in its entirety and include your new name and handwritten signature. No proof of the change is required. If your name is not current when you go to vote, you must sign the precinct register with your old name. You will also be given a Voter Registration Application to make the name change for the next election.
