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## WHAT IS NEW IN NEVADA ELECTIONS!!

Nevada elections just got even more accessible to all voters and below you will see a brief outline of the 2019 Legislative Session changes to the voting process. For more details please go to our website at [www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote](http://www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote) and click on the “WHAT’S NEW IN NEVADA ELECTIONS”.

**\*Automatic Voter Registration** at the Nevada DMV, will be available beginning January 2, 2020, for eligible voters. During your transaction with the NV DMV, you will be automatically registered to vote, unless you choose to opt out of registration. Reference State Question Number 5 of 2018 General Election and AB345 of the 2019 Legislative Session.

**\*Same Day Registration** will be available to all eligible voters wishing to update or complete a new registration during the early voting period, or on Election Day, at all voting locations. Online registration and updates to existing registration may be entered through the Thursday before Election Day. You may only register online using the Nevada Secretary of State's website at [www.RegistertoVoteNV.gov](http://www.RegistertoVoteNV.gov). Reference AB345 of the 2019 Legislative Session.

**\*Mail/Absentee Ballot** request deadline has changed to the 14<sup>th</sup> day before Election Day. Voters may now make a one-time request to receive a permanent mail/absentee ballot status for all future elections. All voted mail ballots must be received by 7pm on Election Day or postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the Election Department on or before the seventh day after Election Day. Reference AB345 of the 2019 Legislative Session.

**\*Restoration of Right to Vote** law has changed for Nevada residents with felony convictions in Nevada or in any other state who are currently not in prison. They are now allowed to immediately register to vote. This also applies to persons whose voter registration had been previously cancelled because of a felony conviction and to persons who are currently on probation or parole. No special procedures or paperwork are required. Such persons need only follow the standard procedures for voter registration and must also satisfy the standard voter registration eligibility requirements.

**\*Provisional Voting** will now include a full ballot, regardless of the reason for casting a provisional ballot. This means they will contain all offices, candidates, and questions that would be on a regular ballot for the voter's precinct. After an election, the Secretary of State will establish a system, such as a website or toll-free number, to inform voters of provisional status.

## 2020 PRIMARY FEDERAL/STATE ELECTIONS

Federal/State Elections are in even-numbered years. The Primary Election is the second Tuesday in June of each even-numbered year. The General Election date is the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.

## CANDIDATE FILING

### December 30, 2019

Monday

### Last Day for Candidates for Partisan Offices to Change Affiliation with a Major Party:

No person may be a candidate of a [major political party](#) for partisan office in 2020 if he or she changed political affiliation to Democrat or Republican on a Voter Registration Application in Nevada or in any other state after December 30, 2019. ([NRS 293.176](#))

**Independent Candidate Petition Filing:** Period during which an independent candidate must submit his or her petition of candidacy to the appropriate filing officer for verification. Prior to circulating the petition, a copy must be submitted to the filing officer. Contact the [Secretary of State](#) for more information. ([NRS 293.200\(1\)\(a\)](#))

**Judicial Candidate Filing:** Period during which judicial candidates for State Supreme Court, Nevada Court of Appeals, District Court (including Family Division), and Justice of the Peace may file to run for office in 2020. ([NRS 293.177\(1\)\(a\)](#))

Friday, 5pm

**Last Day for Judicial Candidate Name Changes:** Last day judicial candidates may change how their name appears on the ballot. ([NAC 293.081](#))

### January 29, 2020

Wednesday, 5pm

**Last Day to Withdraw or Rescind Withdrawal of Judicial Candidacy:** Last day judicial candidates may withdraw their candidacy or rescind withdrawal of candidacy. ([NRS 293.202](#))

### March 2-13, 2020

Weekdays, 8am-5pm

**Candidate Filing (Non-Judicial):** Period during which non-judicial candidates may file to run for office in 2020. ([NRS 293.177\(1\)\(b\)](#))

**Last Day for Candidate Name Changes (Non-Judicial):** Last day non-judicial candidates may change how their name appears on the ballot. ([NAC 293.081](#))

### March 24, 2020

Tuesday, 5pm

**Last Day to Withdraw or Rescind Withdrawal of Candidacy (Non-Judicial):** Last day non-judicial candidates may withdraw their candidacy or rescind withdrawal of candidacy. ([NRS 293.202](#))

## **PRESIDENTIAL CAUCUSES**

Pursuant to [Nevada law](#), Nevada does not conduct Primary Elections to select Presidential candidates. Instead, [major political parties](#) will hold caucuses in the beginning of 2020. The political parties determine the dates, times, and locations of the caucuses and deadlines by which to be registered to attend. **The Clark County Election Department is not involved in the conduct of caucuses.** Directly contact your [party](#) for information about caucuses, including their registration requirements and deadlines.

## **JUNE 9, 2020, PRIMARY ELECTION (FEDERAL/STATE) AND SAME-DAY REGISTRATION**

*From 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, ANY Clark County registered voter may cast their ballot at ANY Clark County Vote Center of their choice. Starting in 2020, same-day registration (registering and voting on Election Day or during Early Voting), as well as immediate updates of existing registration (name, party, and address) will also be available at all of our voting sites.*

A Primary Election is a preliminary (nominating) election to select, when necessary, Democratic, Republican, and nonpartisan candidates who will run in the General Election contests (except special district candidates as they only appear in the General Election). The direct vote of the people selects the candidates, rather than votes of convention delegates. Nevada has [CLOSED Primary Elections \(NRS 293.257\)](#). The Primary Election must be held on the second Tuesday in June of each even-numbered year ([NRS 293.175\(1\)](#)).

Starting in 2020, at any Clark County Election Day Vote Center or at any early voting site, you may: (1) Register in-person and vote (same-day registration), but you must show a current and valid Nevada's Driver's License or Nevada State Identification card with the current address where you actually live, or if the address is not current, you must additionally provide other proof of residence; or (2) Immediately update your existing registration, including name, party, and address changes, and then vote a ballot for your new precinct and/or party, as applicable. ([Sections 5.9, 8, and 9 of AB345](#) of the 2019 Legislative Session).

**Close of Mail-In and In-Person Standard Registration:** Last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration by mail or in-person at the [Election Department](#) offices. ([NRS 293.560](#) as amended by [Section 64 of AB345](#), 2019 Legislative Session)

Wednesday-Tuesday

**Online Registration with Sample Ballot Delivery and with ID Required for Voting:** Register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY on the [Secretary of State's website](#) and still receive a sample ballot for the current election from the Election Department for your new registration or with updated information for your existing registration. New Registrants may not vote by mail/absentee ballot in the current election. When new registrants check-in to vote, they must show a current and valid Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identification card with an address that matches the one in the online registration. If the address does not match, they must additionally show other proof of residence. ([Section 6 of AB345](#), 2019 Legislative Session, and [NRS 293.565\(7\)](#))

**Online Registration without Sample Ballot Delivery and with ID Required for Voting:** Register to vote or update your existing registration ONLY on the [Secretary of State's website](#). The Election Department is NOT legally required to send you a sample ballot for the current election for your new registration or with updated information for your existing registration. New Registrants may not vote by mail/absentee ballot in the current election. When new registrants check-in to vote, they must show a current and valid Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identification card with an address that matches the one in the online registration. If the address does not match, they must additionally show other proof of residence. ([Section 6 of AB345](#), 2019 Legislative Session, and [NRS 293.565\(7\)](#))

**May 23-June 5, 2020**  
Saturday-Friday

**Early Voting (14 Days) and In-Person Same Day Registration at any Early Voting Site, Hours and Days Vary by Location:** Any voter registered in Clark County may vote at any early voting site within the County. You may also register and vote (same-day registration) or immediately update your existing registration (including name, address, and party) at any early voting site. Same-day registrants must show a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identification card with the current address where they actually live. If the address is not current, they must provide other proof of residence. ([NRS 293.3568](#) and [Sections 5.9 and 8 of AB345](#), 2019 Legislative Session).

**May 26, 2020**  
Tuesday, 5pm

**Mail/Absentee Ballot Request Deadline:** Last day for the [Election Department](#) to RECEIVE WRITTEN mail ballot requests. If you registered online on or after May 13, you may not vote by mail/absentee ballot in the current election. ([NRS 293.313](#) as amended by [Section 43 of AB345](#) of the 2019 Legislative Session).

# FUND RAISING THROUGH ELECTION VOLUNTEERING

## RAISE THE VOTE PROGRAM

The Clark County Election Department invites and encourages businesses, non-profits churches and school clubs to partner with us for the purpose of supporting the electoral process by providing personnel to serve as poll workers on Election Day. In addition to serving the community, your organization or school club can also use this opportunity to raise funds. Each club provides personnel to staff a Vote Center. We provide the training. Volunteers may then donate their earnings to your organization or school club. Or, if you have a W-9 form on file with the IRS, the Election Department will directly pay your group instead of paying the individuals. By forming a partnership with the Election Department, fundraising efforts are directed toward a worthwhile cause and the public is served by having qualified workers at our

Vote Centers.

We encourage you to produce signs or t-shirts with your organization name to post or wear on Election Day. All designs must be approved by the Election Department.

## *Directly Notify the Election Department*

When you change your address, name or political party, be sure to inform the Election Department BEFORE the registration deadline. Updating your DMV or Post Office records will NOT also update your voter registration. Quickly see your registration information on record with the Clark County Election Department by logging in to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and selecting **View My Registration Information** from the dropdown menu.

### Address Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may [change your address online](#) at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Address** from the dropdown menu to complete and print a form to mail before the registration deadline; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your address change before the registration deadline. If non-forwardable mail, such as your Voter Registration Card or sample ballot, is returned as "undeliverable" or indicating you've moved, your registration may become "[inactive](#)." The National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires the Election Department to CANCEL your registration if your registration is "inactive" and you do not vote in two consecutive federal elections. You must then re-register to vote again.


### Party Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may [change your political party affiliation online](#) at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Party Affiliation** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your party change before the registration deadline.

### Name Changes

Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Name** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application. You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your name change before the registration deadline. When you change your name by marriage or other legal means, properly complete a Voter Registration Application in its entirety and include your new name and handwritten signature. No proof of the change is required. If your name is not current when you go to vote, you must sign with your old name. You will also be given a Voter Registration Application to make the name change for the next election.

# INFORMED DELIVERY BY THE U.S. POST OFFICE

 Digitally preview your mail and manage your packages scheduled to arrive soon! Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mailpieces and track packages in one convenient location. You can check the delivery of your mail ballot with this easy to use service. To sign up, go to [www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote](http://www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote) and click on the link “CHECK DELIVERY OF YOUR MAIL BALLOT” using the USPS “Informed Delivery” Service in the Explore Box.
