*"These are some of the problems discovered so far: Numerous races, including the congressional race involving Rep. James Bilbray and the hotly contested county commission race between Don Schlesinger and Bob Ryan, were left off the ballot in some precincts; At least 10 polling places opened as much as an hour or more late, which meant many people planning to vote before work were turned away; The computer system used to tally the votes broke down, delaying the final results for more than half a day."

*"The Clark County registrar of voters will recount the results in three closely contested legislative races from last Tuesday's primary."

*"Charles Woods followed up his allegations of election fraud with two letters demanding copies of records relating to balloting procedures."

General Election 1990:

*"Final tabulation of ballots from Tuesday's general election, which drew 59% of eligible voters, was delayed for roughly six hours by jammed ballot-card readers and a computer error that prompted the recount of 22 precincts."

Review Journal November 8, 1990

General Election 1992

*"122 absentee ballots have not yet been returned by overseas and military personnel in District 8. State law provides them 30 days to return the ballots which were mailed out late due to a court order which provided for the addition of minor parties to the ballot. Since new ballots had to be printed, the absentee ballots could not be sent out on time, those with ballots have until November 7, at 5:00 p.m. to return the ballots. Mark Jones currently holds a 24 vote lead over Sandi Drenzer in District 8."
