HOW TO JOIN THE PROGRAM

- Complete an Interest Form. Forms are provided in your packet or are available at:
- www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/RTV
- Provide us a copy of your W-9 form.
- You may email, fax, or mail the forms to us.
- Designate a coordinator in your organization who will work with us to implement the program and serve as the point of contact between your group and the Election Department
- Your designated coordinator will commit to providing a certain number of volunteers.
- The Election Department will assign volunteers to specific Vote Center.
- The Election Department will contact your volunteers to schedule training (if required).

Requirements for Volunteers

- If you are 18 years of age or older, you must be registered to vote in Clark County. The law allows for students 16 & 17 to work without being registered to vote.
- May not be a candidate or a relative of a candidate for nomination or election.
- Must attend and pass a training class (if required).
- Remain nonpartisan.
- Have the skills for the position you will be assigned (See Poll Worker Positions).
- Be ready to work long hours, sometimes more than 14 hours.
- Work well as a team member, demonstrate good judgment, communication, and people skills.



Poll Worker Positions

Monitor

Assists with setup and removal of indoor and outdoor signs. Assists voters using voting machines. Collects Vote cards and distributes "I Voted" stickers to voters.

- *Early Voting Pay \$17 an hour.
- *Election Day Pay \$200 daily flat rate.
- *Training Pay \$50 per class.

Poll Book Operator

Checks in voters using the Poll Pad and assists with Same Day Registration.

- *Early Voting Pay \$17 an hour.
- *Election Day Pay \$200 daily flat rate.
- *Training Pay \$50 per class.

Mail Ballot Clerk

Oversees the mail ballot drop box and makes sure voters sign and seal their mail ballot envelope before dropping it off.

- *Early Voting Pay \$17 an hour.
- *Election Day Pay \$200 daily flat rate.

Line Monitor

Monitor the line looking for voters who need extra help or those violating laws prohibiting campaigning at Vote Centers. Assist handicap voters to the front of the line.

- *Early Voting Pay \$17 an hour.
- *Election Day Pay \$200 daily flat rate.
