Important Dates for the 2019 General Municipal Elections

Municipal Elections are in odd numbered years. Specific dates for 2019 are below. All Municipal Elections (Primary and General) are Nonpartisan. Voters registered in unincorporated areas of Clark County may NOT participate in Municipal Election, i.e., only voters registered within the boundaries of incorporated cities. The cities participating in the General Elections include Boulder City, Las Vegas, and North Las Vegas. For more information, please contact your [City Clerk](#).

June 11, 2019, General Municipal Election [\(NRS 293C.140,145\)](#)

Vote 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day at any Vote Center of your choice, only voters registered within the boundaries of Boulder City, Las Vegas, and North Las Vegas.

May 14

Tuesday, 9:00 p.m.

Close of Standard Registration: Last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration, without having to appear in-person at your [City Clerk's office](#), or without having to register on the [Secretary of State's website](#). [\(NRS 293C.527\)](#)

May 15 - 21

Wednesday - Tuesday

Extended In-Office and Online Registration (7 Days): You may register to vote or update your existing registration **ONLY** by the following means: (1) In-person at your [City Clerk's office](#) or one of the two [Election Department offices](#); or (2) On the [Secretary of State's website](#). [\(NRS 293C.527\)](#)

May 22 - 23

Extended Online Registration (2 Days): You may register to vote or update your existing registration **ONLY** on the [Secretary of State's website](#). **The Election Department/City Clerk is NOT legally required to send you a sample ballot for the current election if you register or update your address during these two days. (NRS 293C.527)**

May 25 – June 7
Saturday - Friday

Early Voting: You may vote before Election Day at any early voting location of your choice if you are registered at an address within the city boundaries of Boulder City, Las Vegas, or North Las Vegas. Hours and days vary by location. ([NRS 293C.3568](#))

Mail/Absentee Ballot Request Deadline: Last day for your [City Clerk](#) or the [Election Department](#) to RECEIVE WRITTEN mail ballot requests. ([293C.312](#))

VIEW YOUR SAMPLE BALLOT ONLINE

E-Sample Ballots will be emailed to eligible voters starting May 15, 2019 and for those receiving a regular paper sample ballot; the mailing begins May 16, 2019 for the 2019 General Municipal Elections. To view a sample of your ballot, log in to "[Registered Voter Services](#)" at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov/vote.

CHECK YOUR VOTER RECORD

Directly Notify the Election Department

When you change your address, name or political party, be sure to inform the Election Department **BEFORE** the registration deadline. Updating your DMV or Post Office records will NOT also update your voter registration. Quickly see your registration information on record with the Clark County Election Department by logging in to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and selecting **View My Registration Information** from the dropdown menu.

Address Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may [change your address online](#) at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Address** from the dropdown menu to complete and print a form to mail before the registration deadline; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your address change before the registration deadline. If non-forwardable mail, such as your Voter Registration Card or sample ballot, is returned as "undeliverable" or indicating you've moved, your registration may become "[inactive](#)." The National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires the Election Department to CANCEL your registration if your registration is "inactive" and you do not vote in two consecutive federal elections. You must then re-register to vote again.

Party Changes

Several options are available: (1) If you have a Nevada Driver's License or Nevada State Identity Card, you may [change your political party affiliation online](#) at the Nevada Secretary of State's website; (2) Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Party Affiliation** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application; or (3) You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your party change before the [registration deadline](#).

Name Changes

Login to our [Registered Voter Services](#) and select **Change My Name** from the dropdown menu to request a Voter Registration Application. You may also call (702) 455-VOTE (8683) to request a form. Make sure you submit your name change before the [registration deadline](#). When you change your name by marriage or other legal means, properly complete a Voter Registration Application in its entirety and include your new name and handwritten signature. No proof of the change is required. If your name is not current when you go to vote, you must sign the precinct register with your old name. You will also be given a Voter Registration Application to make the name change for the next election.

INFORMED DELIVERY BY THE U.S. POST OFFICE

 Digitally preview your mail and manage your packages scheduled to arrive soon! Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mailpieces and track packages in one convenient location. You can check the delivery of your mail ballot or sample ballot with this easy to use service.
