Acquisition & Management of Acquired Easements, Property, Grazing Rights & Water Rights

• Provided updates on Candidate Conservation Agreement with Assurances (CCAA) and relict leopard frog translocations at the Perkin's property along the Muddy River.

- Set up meeting with the Relict Leopard Frog Conservation Team (RLFCT) to discuss channel improvements on Perkin's property.
- Created a Request for Quote for fire breaks and non-native tree removal on Perkin's property.
- Selected contractor and created statement of work for fire breaks and non-native tree removal on Perkin's property.
- Desert Conservation Program (DCP) staff worked several days to clear irrigation ditch of mud caused by heavy rains on the Perkin's property and thereby contributed to relict leopard frog project by maintaining the pond water level.
- Completed the Grant of Options for the purchase of Henrie property from The Nature Conservancy (TNC).
- Completed and closed out the TNC 561 Muddy River Property Management contract with TNC.
- Maintained and managed the Clark County Muddy River Reserve (CCMRR) properties with regular weekly tasks on properties.
- Created a Request for Quote for maintenance work on all CCMRR properties.
- Selected contractor and created statement of work for maintenance work on all CCMRR properties.
- Prepared Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) for performing cadastral surveys on the Virgin River, for review by County's District Attorney's office.
- Prepared purchase requisition to the Nevada State Engineer's Office, Division of Water Resources for filing fees.

Boulder City Conservation Easement

- Verified Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) had completed repairs to washed out desert tortoise fence along US95.
- Met with BLM and Boulder City to resolve issues with "corridors" on the Boulder City Conservation Easement (BCCE).
- Met and developed criteria for finalizing road designation on the BCCE.
- Spent multiple days on the BCCE doing preparation work for a possible desert tortoise monitoring project.

Wild Desert Tortoise Assistance Line

- The line logged 13 calls.
- Two (2) wild tortoises were collected and transferred to the Desert Tortoise Conservation Center.

Public Information and Education (PIE)

- Mojave Max Education Program Continued planning events for 2011 Mojave Max Emergence Contest. Finalized school assembly dates, scheduled tentative dates for winner's field trip, made additional updates to website (www.mojavemax.com). Uploaded photos from 12 years of the contest to Mojave Max's facebook page.
- Mass Media Campaign Continued 2010-2011 advertising campaigns with BLVDS magazine and KNPR and the Las Vegas Review Journal (Business Press, LVRJ Sports Page, Mesquite Local News and El Tiempo publications).
- Pet/Wild Tortoise Campaign Print advertisements continue to run in these Las Vegas Review Journal publications. (The Views, Boulder City Review, Mesquite Local News, El Tiempo and CERCA publications.) Evaluating future advertisement campaigns, postcards and development of a pet tortoise video.
- Developers Outreach Effort Currently developing training course for contractors. Evaluating promotional materials for use in these classes such as pens for all participants and imprinted hats or tools for incentive prizes.
- Future PIE Budgeting Upcoming PIE projects are currently being reviewed to ensure they continue to meet program needs. Evaluating PIE allocations for projects: 2009-CC-807 OHV Outreach (former BLM project), 2009-CC-806 Clark County Public Information and Education and 2011-CC-TBD Clark County Public Information and Education projects.

Desert Tortoise Fencing

 Monitoring and Maintenance of Fencing — Completed monitoring and maintenance of all tortoise-proof fencing in Clark County. Under a contract with the Nevada Division of Forestry (NDF), and with the approval of NDOT, Clark County directed NDF to walk, repair and GPS all existing tortoise-proof fencing on a one time basis. NDF provided ARCGis Shape files of all fencing walked, points where maintenance occurred, type of repair made, materials used and any other incidents.

- BLM/Kern River Pipeline/LSTS Fencing Issue Met with BLM regarding request from BLM for DCP to provide access to pipeline along tortoise fencing in the LSTS as well as BLM's request for DCP to provide significant modifications. Notified BLM that DCP was evaluating future fencing priorities and DCP may opt to transfer responsibility for maintenance and monitoring of LSTS fencing to BLM and NDOT. DCP to notify BLM when fencing determination has been made.
- Monitoring and Maintenance of Fencing (Future Work) Developing contract with NDF to provide fencing monitoring and maintenance upon request of DCP.
- Fencing Transition As the DCP moves forward with the MSHCP permit amendment, fencing responsibilities and priorities may shift. Project manager prepared a comprehensive summary report of all DCP fencing accomplishments to date. Some notable accomplishments are:
 - 424 miles of tortoise-proof fencing have been installed in Clark County since 1995.
 - Multiple agencies have participated in the fencing program (Clark County DCP, BLM, NDF, NDOT, Partners In Conservation (PIC), and NPS).
 - To date, the DCP has spent \$4,134,690 on fencing.
 - The DCP has GIS coverage of all existing fencing.

Permit Amendment

- Continued developing Species Handling Workshop in conjunction with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS).
- Continued developing Desert Tortoise Construction Worker Training.
- Finalized agreement between Clark County and State of Nevada for the transfer of \$500,000 to fund Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles OHV Titling and Registration Program.
- Completed the recommendations of the DCP Community Advisory Committee (CAC) for permit amendment. CAC Final Report was presented to the Board of County Commissioners on November 16, 2010 and to each of the Permittees' Councils in November and December. The CAC will reconvene for one meeting prior to public release of the draft MSHCP in 2011.
- Continue to coordinate permit amendment progress with Permittees on a monthly basis.
- Met with BLM and USFWS to discuss permit amendment and related issues, including a proposed revision to the Reserve Strategy.
- Drafting amended MSHCP; projected to be completed Summer 2011.
