- Currently still 8th on Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) waiting list for creation of desert tortoise specialty license plate.
- Continued conversion of permittee refund payments to be made via Automated Clearing House (ACH) or e-check. One permittee still left to be converted.
- Reviewed and provided comments on Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act (SNPLMA) Implementation Agreement final draft.
- Submitted SNPLMA FY12-Q4 project status and FY13-Q1 financial projections reporting.
- Participated in SNPLMA Streamlining Committee conference call for briefing on Executive Committee recommendations.
- Submitted two Round 14 nomination proposals to SNPLMA totaling \$473,150.
- Completed allowable administrative cost analysis and distribution to SNPLMA grants recovering \$17,682.
