Other Administrative Accomplishments

- Processed vendor payments 52 invoices: 50 accepted (96%), 2 rejected (4%).
- Continued reconciliation for Fiscal Year (FY) 12 single audit act compliance.
- Continued process development for centralized fee collection of tortoise fees County has selected a potential vendor for credit card and electronic payments processing and is currently in contract negotiations. Contract should be issued by late spring.
- Currently still 8th on Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) waiting list for creation of desert tortoise specialty license plate.
- Continued conversion of permittee refund payments to be made via Automated Clearing House (ACH) or e-check. One permittee still left to be converted.
- Submitted FY14 County budget and FY13 revenue and expenditure projections.
- Submitted Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act (SNPLMA) FY13-Q1 project status and FY13-Q2 financial projections reporting.
- Submitted SNPLMA closeout packet for DCP and Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP) Administration, Project 544 and scheduled site visit.
- Received SNPLMA Partners Working Group (PWG) approval for two Round 14 nomination proposals. Next step is SNPLMA recommendation to their Executive Committee which meets in August 2013.
- Received reimbursement for SNPLMA projects: Round 6- 3 draw downs (\$238,396), Round 8- 6 draw downs (\$29,400), Round 12-1 draw down (\$3,718).
- Received final updated SNPLMA Implementation Agreement dated 2/5/13.
- Submitted documentation for purchase of a field vehicle. Staff attended County required Core Values and Customer Service classes.
