Other Administrative Accomplishments

- Processed vendor payments for 73 invoices: 67 accepted (92%), 6 rejected (8%).
- Fiscal Year (FY) 15 budgets submitted to the Budget Office for the 2015-2017
 Implementation Plan and Budget (IPB). Budget Office is in the process of loading the budget for verification.
- Continued process development for centralized fee collection of tortoise fees. County
 has selected a potential vendor for credit card and electronic payments processing and
 is currently in contract negotiations. It is going slower than expected and there may not
 be a vendor selected until late fall.
- Continued wait for the desert tortoise specialty license plate application to make it to the top 5 (now 7th on DMV waiting list).
- The budget for two Southern Nevada Public Land Management Act (SNPLMA) Round 14 projects totaling \$473,150.00 loaded in the County's financial system were validated and continue to be monitored for progress and reimbursement.
- Received reimbursement for SNPLMA projects. Round 8: 1 draw down (\$3,128.74).

- Provided Bureau of Land Management (BLM) maps for Commissioner Collins' Open House.
- Provided BLM Maps to the Center of Biological Diversity.
- Provided GIS data to the City of Las Vegas.
- Provided all County-wide species and habitat GIS data to the Southern Nevada BLM office.
- Provided Boulder City Conservation Easement (BCCE) GIS data to the Southern Nevada BLM office on a trespass road issue.

- There were two calls logged during this reporting period.
- There were no desert tortoises picked up during this reporting period. Currently only wild tortoises from construction sites are being picked up.

- Mojave Max Education Program
 - Continued contract with Red Rock Canyon Interpretive Association and continued education programs.
 - Completed fifteen Mojave Max assemblies at various Clark County schools.

Desert Tortoise Fencing

 Amended an Interlocal Agreement with the Nevada Division of Forestry (NDF) to provide funding for maintenance and repair of approximately 350 miles of fencing throughout Clark County due to heavy flooding in the spring.

Adaptive Management Program (AMP)

 Participated in a collaborative work group with other agencies to plan a desert tortoise health assessment training class. Meetings were held on 1/9/2015, 1/22/2015, 2/5/2015, 2/20/2015, 3/5/2015 and 3/19/2015.



- Attended the heath assessment training class, which was conducted 3/23/2015 -3/26/2015.
- Participated in a collaborative work group with other agencies for captive tortoises.
 Meetings were held on 1/20/2015 and 2/17/2015.
- Attended the Colorado River Terrestrial and Riparian meetings in Laughlin, NV 1/27/2015 - 1/29/2015.
- Held a project kick-off meeting with Knight and Leavitt Associates (KLA) for Occupancy Monitoring on 02/09/2015, Project 1012D.
- Assessed culvert on the BCCE for tortoise connectivity and met with United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), BLM, Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), and Nevada Division of Wildlife (NDOW) to discuss a study to look at tortoise movements across culverts in Clark County on 2/19/2015.
