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QUESTION 1: What did you accomplish during this reporting period? How did these accomplishments help you reach the goal of your project? If relevant, what indicators or benchmarks were used to determine your progress?

• Assemblies: We reached over 2,000 students through 16 assemblies this quarter:

- 1st Grade at Triggs, Darnell, Coral Academy of Science Deer Springs, Mathis, Rowe, and Ullom ES
- 2nd Grade at Rowe, Bryan, Vanderburg, Ullom, Walker, and Dickens ES
- 3rd Grade at Abston and Cambeiro ES
- 4th Grade at Garehime, Kesterson, Wynn, Cambeiro, and Adams ES
- 5th Grade at Wynn and Cambeiro ES

We have a larger team of presenters this year who have now all been trained and are comfortable completing assemblies. To keep clear communication flowing, we have structured the program more on the back end and have systematized many components in an attempt to ensure continuity. We now have checklists, calendar inputs with embedded links, and a new and improved stats sheet that is more intuitive and streamlined.

Tortoise Talks: Between 01/1/24 and 3/31/24, GON completed Tortoise Talk presentations for 59 classes reaching 1,307 students. Participating schools included: Hoggard, Goolsby, Deskin, Wolff, Scott, May, Scherkenbach, Explore KNowledge Academy, Bass, Dooley, Morrow, Bryan, French, Neal Steam Academy, Hancock, and Diskin Elementary Schools.

- Outreach Events: GON has not participated in any community outreach events during this quarter. We do have a larger team available to assist this year and have begun preparing for the busy spring season by pre-selecting and calendaring events in collaboration with Audrie.
- Emergence Contest: As of mid-March, there were over 3,300 Emergence Contest guesses. We continue to promote the contest through multiple channels until Max emerges. Our goal is to surpass last year's submissions and accrue at least 4,600 guesses. We hope to gain an uptick around Earth Day festivities coming in April.
- Emergence Contest Winner Classroom Visit and Field Trip: This deliverable will be completed in the second half of the Spring semester. We have been in contact with the Springs Preserve to identify potential field trip dates. We have also confirmed an itinerary for the day as well.

• We have a larger team of presenters this year who have now all been trained and are comfortable completing assemblies. To keep clear communication flowing, we have structured the program more on the back end and have systematized many components in an attempt to ensure continuity. We now have checklists, calendar inputs with embedded links, and a new and improved stats sheet that is more intuitive and streamlined.

Ordering remains slow and, in response, we have begun restricting the number of items handed out to participants this quarter. This is to ensure that each participant receives a takeaway, but that we have the stock to distribute throughout the remainder of the season.

• 75% We have made huge strides towards completion this quarter. With a later start in quarter one, we doubled down on programming in order to finish assemblies before Max emerges in the spring and before the end of the school year. While the bulk of Tortoise Talks and Assemblies are finished for the school year, we look forward to coordinating and hosting the activities associated with the Emergence Contest in the coming weeks.
