The work for the above referenced project has been completed. Please see the attached for all project related information.

The purpose of the above referenced project was:

Recent fires in and around the Muddy River have brought into focus the need to do fire prevention on the newly acquired Muddy River Reserve property (Alamo). To accomplish this purpose a fifteen foot wide fire break was created along the southwest property border. Along the north border and along the river tamarisk was removed and palm trees were removed or trimmed/skinned.

The major accomplishment or findings of this project include:

The risk of fire on the property and fire spreading to neighboring property was greatly reduced by the removal of 33 tamarisk and 21 palm trees. Also, 27 palm trees were trimmed/skinned to reduce fuel for fires. To replace the tamarisk removed from along the river we planted 10 cottonwood trees.
