The work for the above referenced project has been completed. Below is a summary of project related information.

The purpose of the above referenced project was:

The Mojave Max Education Program is a community education effort, with goals of cultivating an understanding and appreciation of the Mojave Desert and desert tortoises; foster positive behavior towards conservation of the Mojave Desert and the desert tortoise (reducing litter, staying on roads and trails, not removing tortoises from the desert); and to encourage participants to respect, protect, and enjoy the Mojave Desert and native species.

The major accomplishments or findings of this project include:

- Conducted 80 Tortoise Talk classroom programs to Clark County elementary school students annually,
- Conducted 14 assemblies to Clark County elementary school students annually,
- Conducted the annual Mojave Max Emergence Contest in Clark County elementary schools , including a classroom announcement and Springs Preserve field trip for the winning class,
- Conducted tabling and outreach events with the Mojave Max mascot as requested throughout the year.
