The work for the above reference project has been completed. Below is a summary of project related information.

The purpose of the above referenced project was:

The purpose of this project was to conduct research and provide summaries and documentation of existing or planned encumbrances and land uses within nine proposed Special Management Areas (SMA). The SMA's were identified as part of Clark County's effort to amend the current Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP) to balance the needs of sustainable growth and conservation more effectively.

The major accomplishments or findings of this project include:

Multiple formats of Bureau of Land Management (BLM) information were reviewed, including electronic, published documents, and case files at the Las Vegas Field Office. Information was also obtained pertaining to water rights from the electronic information from the Nevada Division of Water Resources. This review included the identification of existing encumbrances, designations, and land management practices within the individual SMA boundaries. Specific emphasis was placed on identifying Rights of Way's, Water Rights, Mining Claims, and BLM land use designations. No indication of the presence of occurrence of hazardous materials was found in the review.
