**February 7** - Chief John Steinbeck appointed as Fire Chief

**February 24** - Department reclassification to ISO1

**March 5** - MACC activated to Level 3 to monitor COVID-19 Pandemic

**March 12** - State of Emergency for COVID-19 declared by Governor Steve Sisolak

**April 13** - Activated Medical Surge Area Command to assist with hospital response to COVID-19

**May 5** - Began community based COVID-19 testing (CCFD assisted sites performed over 490,000 COVID-19 tests in 2020)

**July 6** - Awarded the FY20 AFG Covid19 Supplemental in the amount of \$965,994.40

**July 26 - October 31** - Eight (8) FEMA Deployments for storm and/or fire related emergency events to Hawaii, Louisiana and Oregon

**August 27** - Awarded the FY19 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant in the amount of \$469,462
