Business Impact Questionnaire

Proposed Amendments to Clark County Code Title 13, Chapter 13.04

Clark County Fire Prevention Bureau

The following questions pertain to how the changes presented in the enclosure will affect your business. Prior to the adoption of the proposed regulation, the Clark County Board of County Commissioners is required by NRS 237.080 to make a concerted effort to determine whether the proposed rule will impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a business or directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a business. Due to this, trade associations, owners and officers of businesses which are likely to be affected by this proposed rule, and any other interested persons are required to be notified and provided an opportunity to submit comments, data, or arguments to the County regarding whether the proposed rule will:

- a) Impose a direct and significant economic burden upon a business; or
- b) Directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a business.

If it is determined that the proposed regulation is likely to impose a direct and significant burden upon a business; or directly restrict the formation, operation, or expansion of a business; then the agency will take any or all of the following actions:

1. Insofar as practicable, consult with owners and officers of the affected business,
2. Consider methods to reduce the impact of the proposed regulation, and
3. Prepare a business impact statement and make copies of the statement available to the public at the workshop conduct and the public hearing held pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 233B.061.
