Highlights of the Year

On July 1, 62 supplemental positions were added to the Department's ranks

On August 9, Station 35 at 10350 W. Flamingo Road (Flamingo and the 215 in Summerlin) opened

On August 2, an additional Rescue was deployed out of Station 33, located at 865 E. Desert Inn

On October 31, the Heavy Rescue was staffed full time by bid in personnel at Station 21 located at 5015 W. Oquendo Road

On October 31, Truck 11 moved to Station 24, located at 7525 Dean Martin Drive to respond to special events on the Strip corridor

On October 31, an additional Rescue was deployed to respond from Station 24 to assist with special events

Secured \$757,976 of funding through Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) for the implementation of the Blue Card Certification program
