**VI. Receive the Director's Report on the Activities of the Department of Juvenile Justice Services from Assistant Director Michael Whelihan**

**a. Budget/Personnel**

- a. Our next JPO Academy will begin at the end of the month with 9 cadets.
- b. There are several positions being filled at this time including JDAs, clerical, and a third assistant director.
- c. We submitted a request for a third Evening Reporting Center but will not hear back until June.

**b. Legislature –** We continue to prepare requests for next legislation session. Mr. Whelihan is researching other State's laws to see if our youth can benefit from anything we are missing. He also reached out to Robert F. Kennedy Foundation for any creative ideas around funding.

**c. Juvenile Detention Reform**

- a. Our population in Detention was at 130 today. State youth continue to keep our numbers high as an average stay for a State youth is 41 days compared to 16 days for non-state youth. DJJS management has met again with the State on possible solutions or diversions to reduce this problem.
- b. Legislative requirement with Youth Level of Screening (YLS) is in full swing. YLS helps determine a youth's risk level by removing implicit biases and focusing on facts. This will ensure that youth are receiving appropriate levels of supervision based on their risk level. The assessment takes 4-6 hours but will make Court orders more consistent based on charges, not the child.

**d. Juvenile Justice Programming**

- a. SMYC has successfully passed our 2019 PREA audit. The follow up report was very labor intensive but we are in full compliance. In November, we will audit our Detention facility. DJJS was awarded a grant working with the federal PREA center. Our Detention center will be used as a training site for PREA auditors. The first test will be in October 2020.
- b. Caseload Pro or Family Tracs 2.0 will go live February 14<sup>th</sup>. It will take 2 days to transfer all data.
- c. Chronic Absenteeism-Assistant Director interviews were held recently. We plan to have one selected by next meeting date. Once the AD is chosen, we will open the 2 manager vacancies, then the 4 management analysts and finally, the part time hourly. A big focus for this program will be redefining what truancy is. Policies and procedures will be made to protect children, educate families, parents, and the community, and to provide trainings for CCSD on diversion tactics.
- e. **The Harbor Update**
  - a. The 2 current Harbor locations have serviced over 12 thousand families and still stay at a 5% recidivism rate.
  - b. Mr. Martin met with Henderson officials to find a location for a Harbor site.
  - c. The purchase for the Greystone complex on Flamingo is complete. This building will house the Eastside Harbor and the T-POP program.
