WALK or BIKE- Routes here!

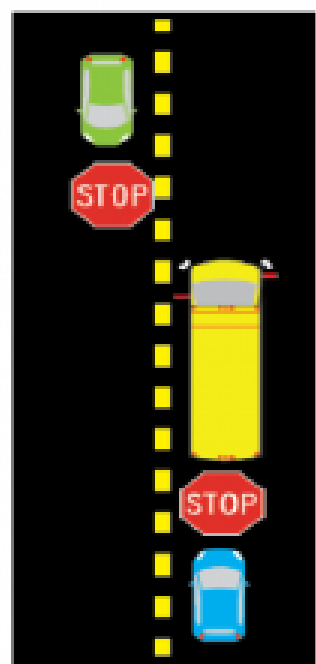

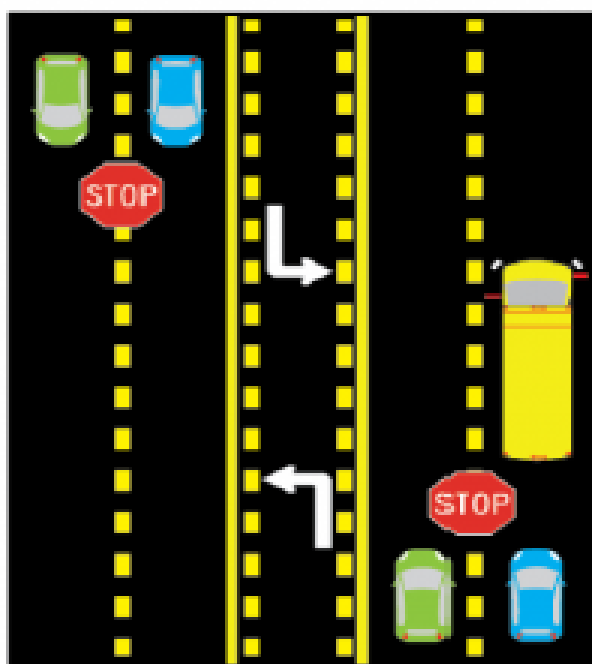

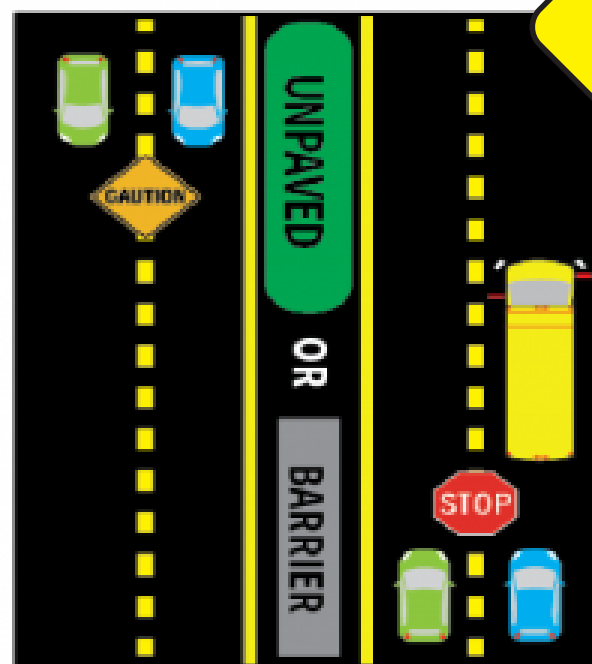
It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present, especially before and after school. Below is a quick reference on stopping for school buses.



TWO LANE
Vehicles traveling in both directions **MUST** stop.



MULTI-LANE PAVED ACROSS
Vehicles traveling in both directions **MUST** stop.



DIVIDED HIGHWAY
Unpaved space 5 ft+/raised median/physical barrier.
Vehicles behind bus **MUST** stop.
Vehicles traveling in the opposite direction must proceed with caution.

Clark County Oversees the Foster Care Program

On July 30, I partnered with Formula 1 and Commissioner Gibson to sponsor a three-day back-to-school event for those in the Clark County Foster system. The kick-off event included a party with food, mocktails, a D.J., photo booth and supplies to get families ready for the school year. During the distribution, 1,252 children were serviced with backpacks filled with school supplies, new shoes, socks, Lazy Dog free kids meal certificate, school uniforms, and haircut vouchers.



TEENS IN FOSTER CARE

Homes are especially needed for teen-agers. On any given day, 30-40 teenagers are waiting on the Child Haven campus for a safe and stable foster home. These teenagers have goals of graduating high school, getting a job, opening a bank account, and figuring out life beyond foster care. They need support from caring adults who can guide them in the right direction.



How many foster kids are in Clark County?

There are approximately 3,400 children, any given day, in Clark County's foster care, from toddlers to teenagers. Foster parenting is about believing and investing in the future of a child and their biological family.

Expedited foster care training is designed for families who are fully committed to becoming a foster parent and would like to start right away. This is a fast-paced course that covers training requirements within two intensive weekends, with a full-day of training on Saturday and Sunday each weekend.

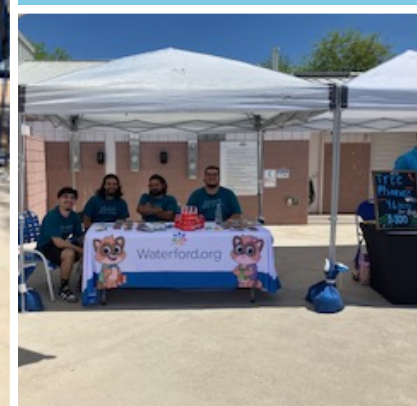

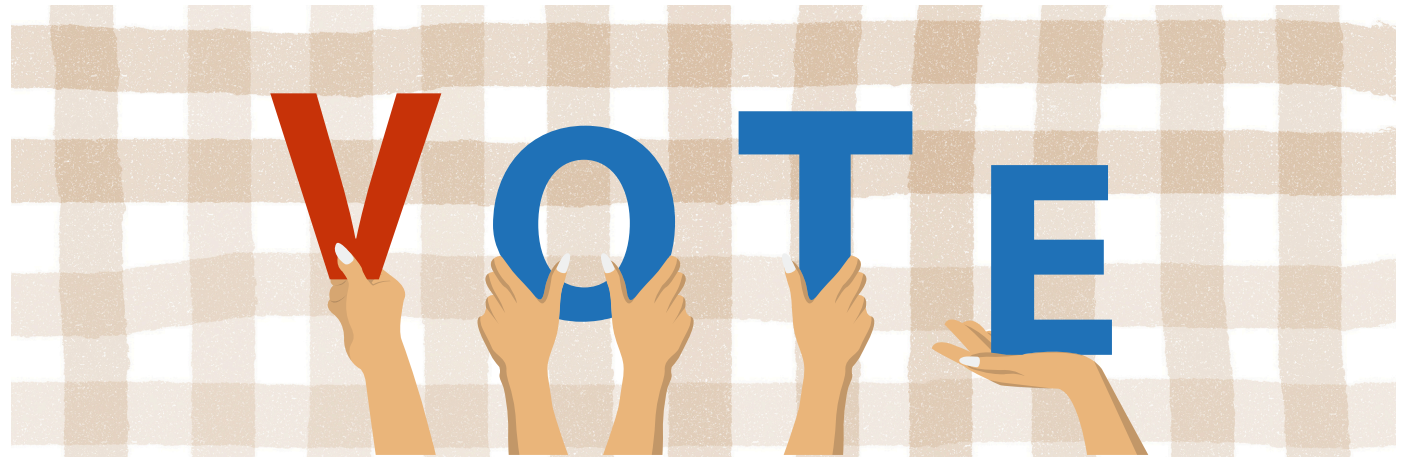

Formula 1 Las Vegas Grand Prix is headed back to Las Vegas Nov. 21-23, 2024.

This can mean construction and traffic delays in and around the Las Vegas Strip and the Resort Corridor.

Las Vegas residents are encouraged to opt-in to the service by texting F1LV to 31996. Those enrolled will receive a text message every Sunday and Wednesday and additional messages during the week as needed. Messages will begin at the end of August in advance of roadwork that is scheduled to begin early September.

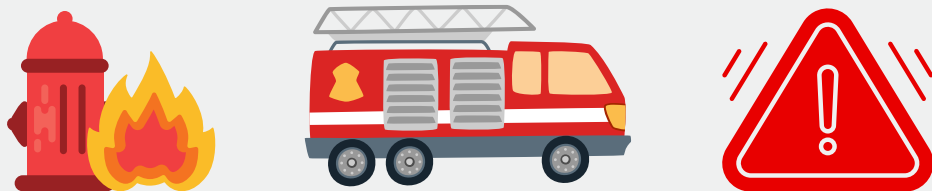

September is Emergency Preparedness Month

September is National Emergency Preparedness Month and Clark County's Fire Department is reminding the public that resources are available to help residents prepare for emergencies of all types.

“Fires, floods and other emergencies are unpredictable by nature, but there are some basic steps people can take to help themselves in any emergency situation,” said Clark County Fire Department Deputy Chief Billy Samuels, who oversees the County's Emergency Management Division. “A key is to identify your specific needs, whether you are an older person living alone, have children or pets or family members with special needs.”

CodeRED Alerts

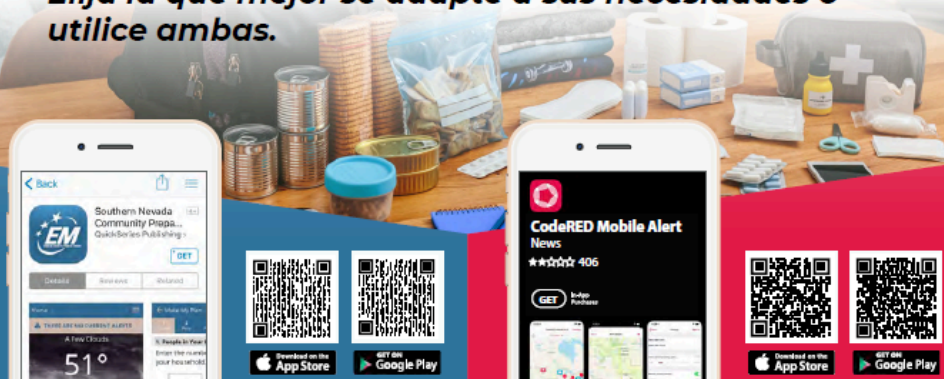
- Sign up to receive free emergency email or text alerts through this community notification system.
- Alerts are geographically based, alerting residents only in the affected area.
