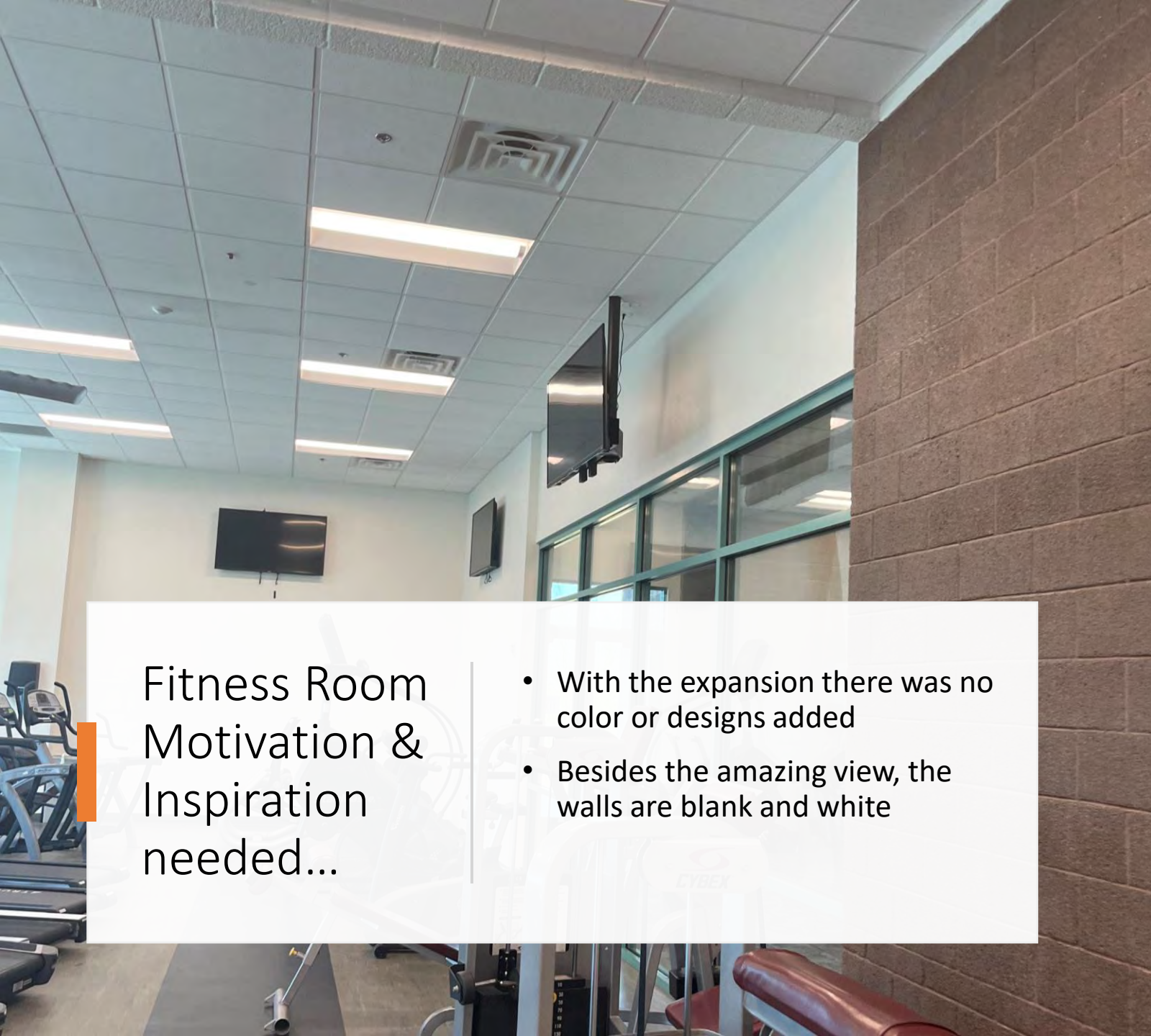
- In 2012 a proposal was submitted for an expansion of fitness room. The community had outgrown the space due to the need and popularity of the fitness room.

Purpose, Mission & Goals

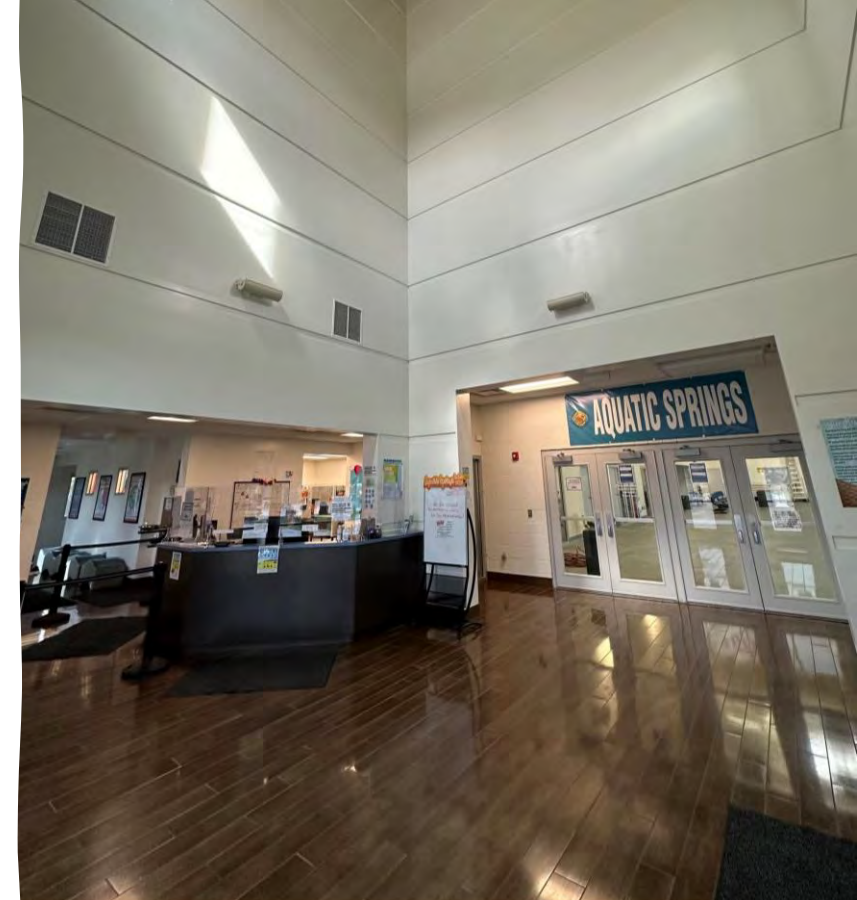

Empowerment Art is currently in the middle of the workshops with chosen artist Vanessa Maciel. Her workshops with the Desert Breeze Community Center youth started Monday at 3pm. Vanessa opens her workshops with an empowering video for the kids, followed by a discussion about empowerment. After the conversation, Vanessa teaches the kids how to create collages to express their feelings about what they spoke about.

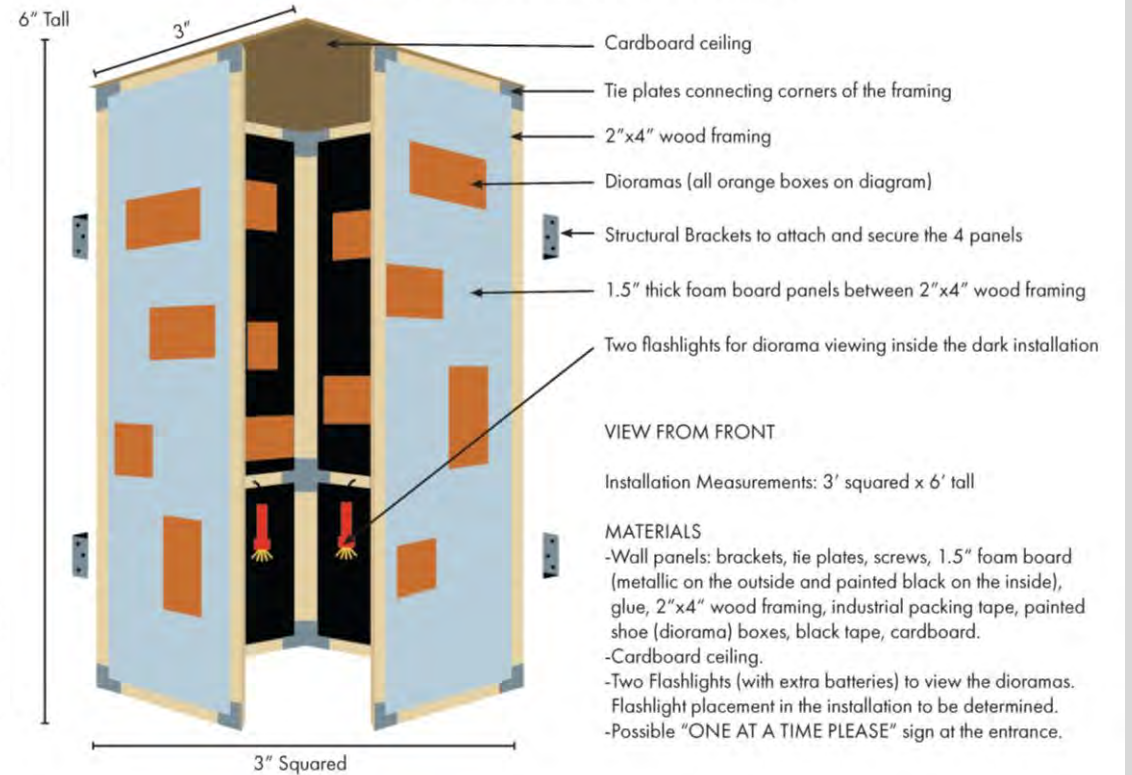
WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

For Wetlands Park, I'd like to present a glimpse of the flora and fauna that thrive in the Las Vegas Valley. For the Clark County Museum, I'd like to highlight human history in our valley.

DESCRIPTION OF INSTALLATION



BYLIZET is a multidisciplinary artist originally from the Bronx, New York now based in El Paso, TX. Her work explores symmetry and various color schemes. For years, Britny worked with multiple methods such as printmaking, graphic design, fiber arts, jewelry making. Now, she works with public art organizations, home owners and property management companies to utilize the arts as a platform for community building, beautification, and revitalization. Her aim is to make a positive impact in multiple spaces by adding color, life and hope within any environment.

3/14/23 Update: After the workshop, Britny had a delay in coming to Las Vegas but is currently scheduling her painting for the end of March.

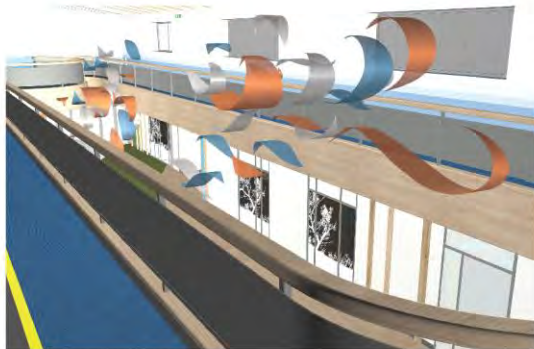

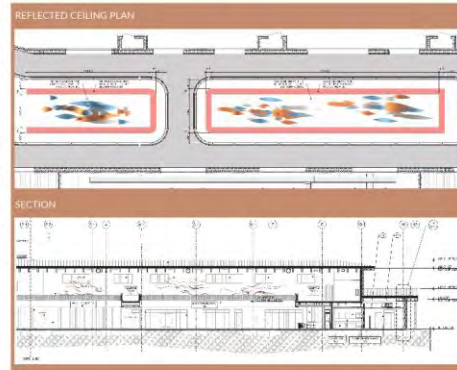
Bringing nature indoors, abstract elements curl and dance through the main circulation area to compose Desert Winds. Copper, silver, and blue finishes mirror the color palette of the surrounding landscape as well as the finishes of the building.

"When I think of Las Vegas and the surrounding landscape, I remember the wind, sloping down from the mountains and keeping the city bathed in near constant motion. My proposed sculpture is one of 'Desert Winds,' with abstracted and curled gusts weaving down the main corridor.

The shapes will lend themselves to different interpretations, such as clouds or waves, giving each viewer the opportunity to create their own narrative."

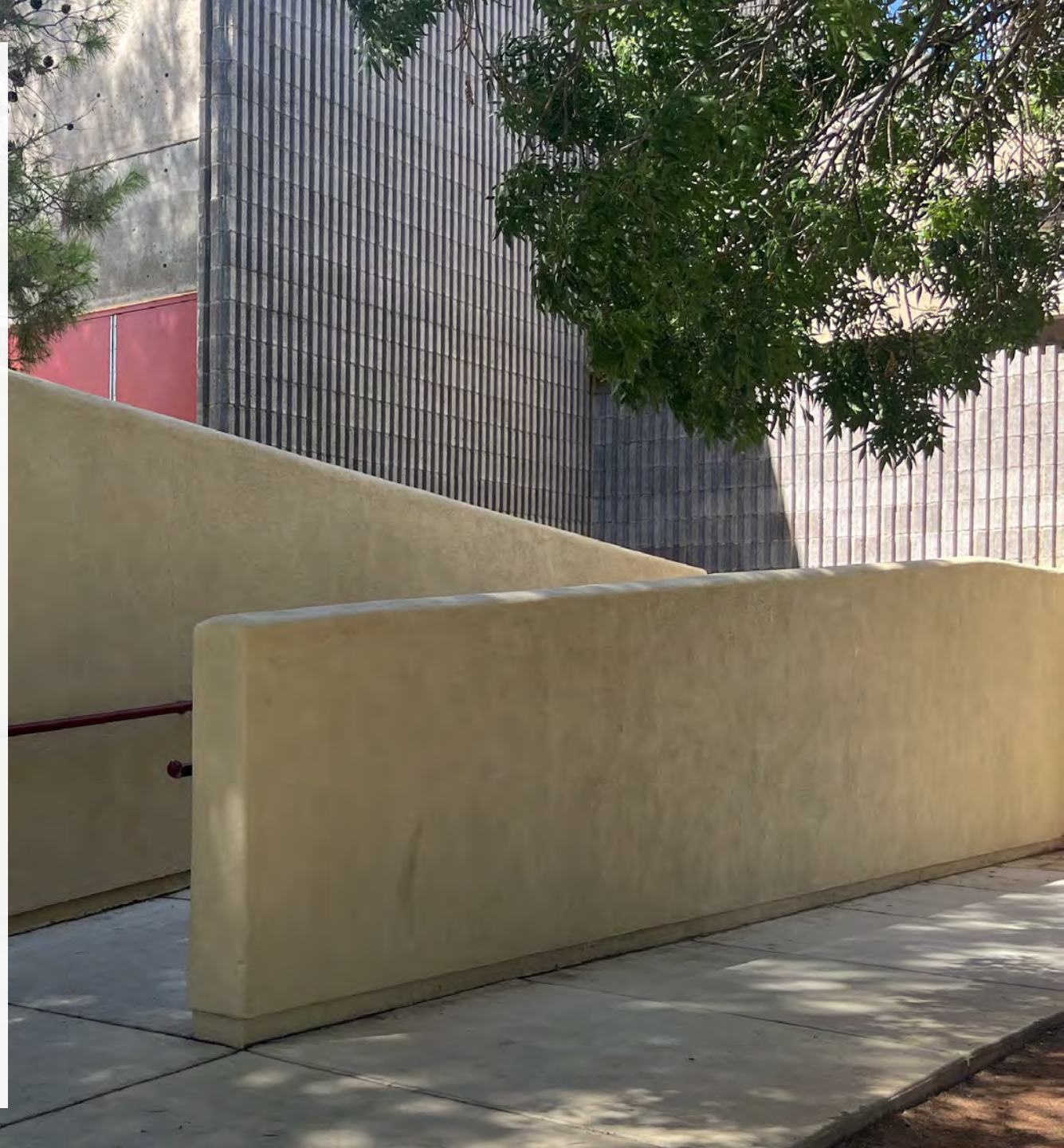

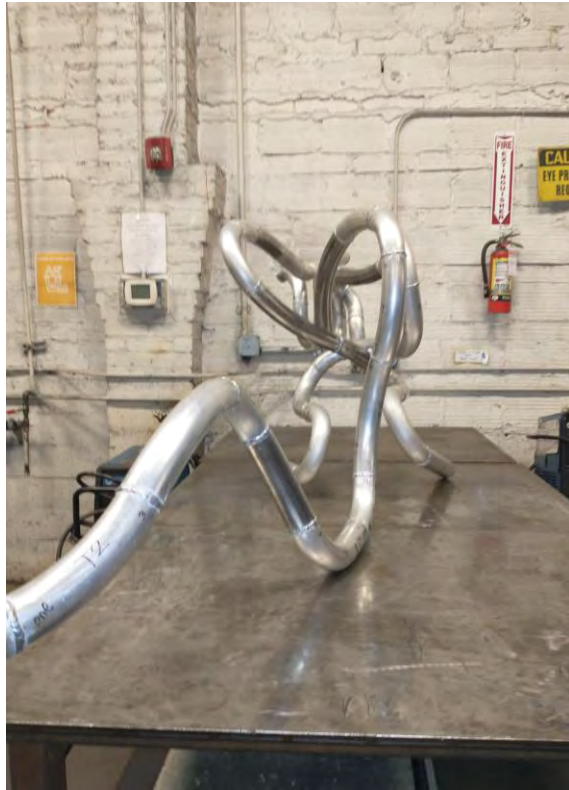
