1. Artist Interest Statement Including:

- a) A statement regarding your philosophy as an artist, your artistic process, and your chosen media.
- b) Your familiarity with Clark County Wetlands Park and why you feel your art is a good fit for the mission and culture of this specific location.
- c) How many pieces you have ready to exhibit.
- d) The **title** and **theme** you would give this exhibit.
- e) Your date availability over the next 24 months. Shows typically remain on exhibit for a three month period.
- f) Your preference for which gallery space is reserved.

2. Portfolio

Please submit 5-10 examples of previous artwork that is relevant to this project.

3. CV

Please provide a Curriculum Vitae (CV) or resume, up to two (2) pages. List any gallery and public art experience, if applicable.

What you need to know:

- Artists must agree to leave their work up through the end of exhibition date.
- Artwork must be original. No Al generated art.
- Clark County does not secure insurance on exhibited artwork. Artist will exhibit at their own risk. We encourage you to purchase your own insurance during the exhibit to recover any loss from broken or stolen artwork.
- Clark County does not facilitate sales of artwork. Artists may leave a contact sheet.
- Artwork that contains offensive language, overtly political, religious and/or sexual content or imagery, including nudity, shall not be considered.
- All 2D must be framed and be ready to hang. Clark County does not provide hardware or make alterations to artwork for display.
- A pedestal will be provided for three-dimensional work selected.
- Oversize/heavy pieces may be disqualified. Clark County reserves the right to disqualify and remove any artwork that poses a threat to fall, break, or cause harm to the public, the facility, or the artwork itself.
