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STORM DRAIN FACILITY IMPACT REQUIREMENTS

As of April 5th, 2021, Clark County Public Works will begin requiring all potential Permittees to verify if proposed work impacts Clark County maintained underground infrastructure (i.e. Storm Drain facilities). This includes but is not limited to storm drain manholes, drop inlets, RCB structures, Arch structures, channels as well as any related piping; RCP, HDPE, C-900, C905, Corrugated Metal, etc.

The following conditions must be verified prior to submittal of Encroachment Permit package:

If the proposed work is within 6' horizontally and/or 18" vertically of Clark County Maintained underground infrastructure, the existing infrastructure must be shown on the work plans.

The Encroachment Permit application has been revised to reflect this requirement.
