

Clark County Recorder's Office Donates Computers to Boulder City Constable's Office

On July 12, Clark County Recorder Debbie Conway donated two surplus personal computers (PC's) to the Boulder City Constable's Office.

In the midst of cost containment, governmental agencies are expected to do more with less by cutting expenses where possible.

Surplus equipment is generally transferred to the Clark County Information Technology (CCIT) Department for review of the list of requirements from other departments. The Finance Department contacted Recorder Debbie Conway after learning of the surplus equipment and having knowledge that the Boulder City Constable's Office was in need of new computers and did not have the necessary funding.

Assistant Recorder Eugene Mendiola and Office Services Supervisor Jared Bradley delivered and assisted with the installation of the donated equipment. According to Recorder Conway, "Our Office is open to collaborative partnerships that create greater efficiencies."
