- Provide public service programs to low income individuals, including the homeless, disabled adults, and seniors.





HUD 5-Year Consolidated Plan

- Outlines community development, housing and homeless needs in the community
- Requires citizen participation in development of plan
- Describes strategies and priorities for project funding

HUD 5-Year Consolidated Plan

- Is application for HUD formula grant funds for:
 - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
 - HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)
 - Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)
 - Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG)

HUD 5-Year Consolidated Plan


- Also affects:




